

## HEAD DECLARES NO FOOD FOR OUTINGS

In a memorandum issued by W. Wade Head, Proj. Dir., Administrative Instruction Order No. 15 to all appointed and evacuee personnel, the following was observed under the subject of "Extra Feeding":

Due to the critical food situation caused by transportation problems and shipping of the U.S. are asked to conserve as much food as possible. Therefore, the people of Poston are urged to recognize this fact and to desist from using food for outing, etc. From this date on, the Chief Steward is hereby instructed to refuse all requests for food to be used except for the regular 3 meals per day and lunches for persons unable to get to the mess halls, and in certain cases where fruit is given to persons working on heavy construction, adobe or subjugation, with the understanding that even this may be curtailed at a later date as the supply of fruit may be only adequate to be used for regular meals.

Mr. Head further stated: "I recognize fully that we do need certain social activities to bolster morale and to give the people of Poston as normal a life as possible....so it hoped that outings will be continued, but keeping in mind that food cannot be furnished by the Government for these purposes other than 3 meals a day. I am sure that all persons concerned will cooperate with the Chief Steward's of

## AGRICULTURE TOUR PLANNED

To facilitate a more efficient and satisfactory method of placing farm labor, Ford Scalley, supervisor of farm labor for Utah-Idaho Sugar Co., this week offered to take representative groups of residents with agricultural experience into the sugar company's territories.

The trip will begin in a week or 10 days when other field men of the company arrive, in Poston to escort the group.

From 12 to 15 representatives of interested parties in the center will be taken on the tour, Scalley said. This group will investigate conditions existing in the company's territories in regards to housing facilities: soil conditions, farm records, public sentiment, etc., and then report its impressions to others in the center. All expenses of the trip will be borne by the sugar company.

Though general farm labor will be contracted, Scalley indicated that the principal emphasis this year will be on share-crop farming. Since all equipment and materials will be furnished by the company, farming on a share-crop basis would afford an opportunity to many families to rehabilitate themselves.

Scalley and recognized that he personally is not responsible for such curtailment, but rather is acting as a servant of the Government and also attempting to comply with the regulations imposed upon all people of the U.S. at this time."

He was visiting Poston with Dr. R.B. Snavely, district U.S. Indian Service health officer.

While here he renewed acquaintances his old friend Dr. George Kawachi whom he has known since 1929.

The Poston hog ranch employees refused to continue work unless they receive special free clothing--stating that their wives were complaining, some even going so far as threatening to leave them. The wives didn't mind the 70 cents per day the men earned, but that extra scent was a little too much.

To reinstate domestic tranquility, a wire was sent to Washington Wed. from the local employment office, recommending that special clothing be issued to these workers.
