### BET GROWERS TO TOUR FARM

Supervisors of the Agricultural Department of all three Units are taking applications from experienced sugar beet growers interested in making investigation tours of share-crop farm deals in Idaho and Montana, it was announced yesterday by the Employment Office.

The group selected to make the trip will report on deals, conditions and all important facts about farms.

It was disclosed that the Utah-Idaho Sugar Company made the offer to take 15 representatives, including an attorney, to tour company territory and investigate farms which are offered on share-crop basis.

A second group of 15 farmers interested in making the trip will have their meals, hotel accommodations, and car transportation to farms advanced by the firm, if this group provides its own train fares. The Employment Office stated that further information may be obtained from the Supervisor of any of the three Poston Agriculture Departments.

Leave applications (Form WRA-127) must be filed by Feb. 18.

### UNIT III LAUDED FOR SPEEDY WORK

With the close of registration for clearance and recruiting for military service in Unit III, Lt. Bolton made the following personal statement in the presence of Administrator Burge: "We have had the fullest of cooperation from the registration staff of interviewers and helpers, and in the name of the United States Government, we thank them. We have received the best of cooperation from every one including the men registering."

Mr. Burge added his belief that Poston III is to be congratulated for the smoothness and speed with which the registration was handled. Special appreciation was expressed for the work of the interviewers who worked long hours, and for the cooperation of the block managers.

Group after group of men of military age were seen entering the registration office set up at the block 201 dining hall yesterday in answer to the call for leave clearance applications. Many were expected to enlist for the all Nisei combat team, which is being recruited now from every center.

In Unit II, the army staff held a question and answer meeting of all men at the Cottonwood Bowl on Sunday. Registration started yesterday and will be completed Tuesday, according to the timetable of the army recruiting staff.

All other activities were relegated to the background as registration for army service met the full response of the Nisei. Lt. Bolton expressed pleasure in the interest shown by loyal Americans of Japanese ancestry. He stated that he would be proud to command the Nisei combat unit or any part of it.

## **DR. PAGE SPEAKS TO HUGE CROWD**

## Poston Two Councilmen Inducted At Ceremonial Program By Project Director Head

"I do solemnly swear that I will faithfully execute the office of councilmen of the community of Poston and will act in the best interests of its residents. I will preserve and obey the Constitution of the United States and the laws passed by the Council of the community of Poston."

With those simple but significant words, fourteen newly-elected councilmen of Poston Two were officially sworn into their temporary offices by Project Director W. Wade Head Saturday night. The Block 227 representative, Peter Hasegawa was unable to be present.

Unit Two, Adm. James D. Crawford opened the brief ceremonial program by forewarning the legislators of their grave responsibilities and of the fact that they "face new problems of unifying the community."

Project Attorney Theodore Haas, following the induction of the councilmen, gave a short summary of the drafted charter which will soon be presented to the people for their approval. Each of the councilmen were presented with a draft of the Constitution and requested "to study it over." Briefly, the charter calls for an over-all council of Poston with representations from each unit on the following basis: Unit I, 9 votes; and Units 2 and 3, 5 each.

While admitting that several other projects have already adopted a permanent self-government, Attorney Haas expressed his belief that "they are not as

effective as Poston in the council set-up."

He stated that there were "greater bonds between the administration and the evacuees toward self-government here."

John Evans, assistant project director, and Mrs. Johnson, Director Head's secretary, were introduced.

Of the fifteen new councilmen, six of the incumbents were returned to office, namely: Tak Takeuchi, 229; Albert Umino, 222; Kenji Uyeno, 226; Dr. Frank Ito, 220; Sumio Nishi, 219; and John Nakamura, 213.

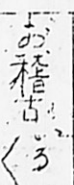
