

## SUGIYAMA TO HEAD MANPOWER COMMISSION

Franklyn S. Sugiyama, TQC chairman, was elected to head the newly created manpower commission at its first meeting held in the headquarters of the Executive Board.

Preliminary ground work for the proper functioning of the manpower commission was laid in thrashing out problems of policies in discussions that consumed most of the evening's time.

The body, however, decided to present a personnel schedule which will probably prevent a manpower waste. In order to make the program overall, representatives will be invited from Units 2 and 3.

In another action of the group, the camouflage factory labor which had been frozen for two weeks, was opened and placed on a voluntary basis.

8,500 workers are available in all of the three units, including school children, according to the employment office. The commission concluded that 2,000 residents might be expected to leave. The body will plan on the basis of a total population of 15,000 to 16,000.

Chosen as Executive Secretary of the manpower commission was Frank Fukuda.

Speaking on the leave clearance, Vernon Kennedy announced that the procedure has been reduced to two steps.

## 77 CLEARED

The WRA office at Washington this week granted leave clearances to 77 Poston residents, according to an announcement yesterday from the local Leave Office. The figure, by far the largest to date, was believed to indicate the speeding up of the process for clearing applicants.

Not only the WRA, which has increased its personnel, but other agencies connected with the clearances have speeded up their re-

view of cases, leave officers reported.

"Before, we were lucky to get back a dozen cases from the FBI in a day," said Giles Zimmerman who recently spent two weeks in the WRA office at Washington. "Now the FBI is reviewing and clearing 80 and 90 cases a day."

The processing of all applications is expected to be completed by May 1.

Zimmerman, who is here at present to gain direct contact with the attitude of the evacuees before returning East to head the WRA field office in Detroit, pointed out the important role of the center Employment Divisions, which includes the Leave Office, plays in the entire program. "It is the main channel through which evacuees may relocate themselves in jobs on the outside," Zimmerman said.

Vernon R. Kennedy, Chief of the Employment Division, is establishing a special staff in each unit to handle outside employment.

"We are aware of the importance of the relocation program," Kennedy declared, "and we are trying to set up an adequate personnel in adequate working space so that we can work effectively towards the goal of successful resettlement of everyone in Poston who desires to leave the center."

## BILL TO AMEND NATIONALITY ACT OF 1940

The bill was referred to the Committee on Immigration and Naturalization which reads as follows: To Amend the Nationality Act of 1940: Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that section 303 of the Nationality Act of 1940, approved October 14, 1940 (54 Stat. 1142, 8 U.S.C. 703), be and hereby is amended by striking out the said section and enacting a new section replacing it to (cont. on page 2)

# SANITATION DEPARTMENT SEEKS CONTROL OF HOUSE FLIES

## SUPERINTENDENT JOB OPEN AT ALCOHOL PLANT

## PUBLIC HEALTH ESPERTS ON VISIT

Facing the danger spreading communicable diseases through house flies, the Department of Sanitation is undertaking a campaign to exterminate flies, it was announced yesterday by Dr. George Wada.

Articles on methods of fly control was released in conjunction with a poster campaign on the subject sponsored by the Unit III Industry Department. The purpose of the article and campaign is to educate the public by various means on the importance of cutting down to a minimum the danger of spreading communicable diseases within the community, Dr. Wada pointed out.

The first article, "Control of Breeding Places," follows:

"House flies are increasing in number, everything should be done to check their growth. The best way is to control breeding.

Flies tend to breed in places where there is moisture, warmth, and food for the larvae. Fermenting vegetables, liquid wastes, and garbage cans are likely breeding places.

To prevent breeding in these places, waste food material should be cleaned up and garbage cans and stands kept clean. Special effort should be made to cover up with clean dirt or sand areas where liquid wastes have spread.

## HAWAIIAN ARMY QUOTA BOOSTED

The quota for the Nihei to be inducted into the Army for Hawaii has been boosted from 1,500 to 2,600 the headquarters for the Hawaiian Dept. announced.

The original quota was 1,500.

According to information re-

## INFANTILE PARALYSIS

The extent and severity of an outbreak seems to depend on: 1. Local weather conditions (when the daily maximum atmospheric temperature is over 60°, it is highly dangerous); 2. The number of cases occurring in patients of the more susceptible age groups; 3. The volume and virulence of the infectious agent present in the infected community.

Infectivity of poliomyelitis increases every day after the first day of illness, until 100% is reached in from 7 to 14 days.

Location of the paralysis usually occurs involving the abdomen, spine, or lower extremities, and their combinations. This fact leads to the probability that the infectious agent enters through the nose and mouth, and then is swallowed through the intestinal tract.

Very often the correct diagnosis may not be reached until the appearance of the paralysis and from a public health standpoint, this period of observation, unless some effort at control is made, is the most dangerous.

A method of checking and reporting suspected cases has been established. When the disease is present, reporting of suspected cases is mandatory.

The failure to submit reports for some days is nearly always followed by the formation of new foci of infection, in which the human or the insect carrier plays a prominent role in the transmission of the disease.
