Various other jobs, a few above the domestic class, were coming regularly into the Employment Division, it was reported.

The manpower commission decided to classify all project work into (1) vital, (2) highly desirable, (3) desirable, and (4) less essential. This step was taken in an effort to solve the manpower shortage problems at the commission's second meeting yesterday afternoon.

The manpower commission, which consists of both the evacuee and appointed personnel members, considered the relative importance of work on its relation to "life", "health", and "security".

Cutting necessities down to the basic food requirements of man, and medical attention, the commission listed as vital key work in subsistence departments key hospital work, and block managers.

In group two, which was in the process of being completed when the Chronicle went into production, were the education system, police and fire protection, construction of school buildings, irrigation construction and other highly important work.

Two other groups will probably be listed, according to the consensus of opinion within the commission.

The above classifications were subject to change after further discussion, but it was believed that the meeting would result in an intelligent handling of the manpower situation.

OLD RATION BOOKS**

Any Poston resident still possessing the old sugar ration book No. 1 is requested once again by Len Nelson, Administrative Assistant to the Project Director, to turn it in. Punishment ranging as much as 12 year's imprisonment or \$10,000 fine or both may be imposed for violations.

Nelson yesterday further clarified other matters concerning ration books I and II. He stated that any person, "even one-hour old babies", are entitled to the ration books when leaving camp.

## Block 229 Inundated As Levee Breaks Causing Inconveniences; No Damages

The continuous flow of the canal water was disrupted early Tuesday morning inundating a section of Block 229 as a result of a levee break near the Camouflage plant awakening hundreds of curious Unit II residents.

At the sound of the Mess Hall alarm, excited 229 evacuees awoke to find volumes of water rushing beneath their doorsteps unable to determine the

cause. Careful scrutiny by block members revealed a levee break near the Camouflage plant where they hurriedly shut off the water flow at the irrigation lock located near Block 201. Morning investigation revealed slight property damage other than groans by block residents disgustedly wading through the muddy water for meals.

## Last Rites For Pioneer, Yasujiro Ohama Set For Friday Afternoon, 2:30

Funeral services for Yasujiro Ohama, 79, and one of the oldest pioneer Japanese residents in America, will be held Friday afternoon at the Buddhist Church, Block 214.

The deceased, who came to this country in 1900, first settled in Guadalupe, then moving to Arroyo Grande. Prior to his evacuation to Poston, he was a resident of Sanger for the past ten years.

The pioneer died Saturday after a lingering illness and had

resided at 222-9-C. He is survived by his brother Kunzo Ohama and many grandchildren all of whom are of Poston, except grandson, Sgt. Ohama, who is stationed at Camp Shelby, and who will not be able to attend the rites.

The funeral will be noteworthy in that one of the pall-bearers will be his great grandson, the son of Mr. Taketa of 222.

Rev. Iwanaga will officiate at the rites which will start at 2:30 p.m.
