## DR. CARY TO ATTEND CONFAB ON EDUCATION

Dr. Miles E. Cary, Director of Education for Poston will represent this Center in a conference of WRA Superintendents of Education at the Denver, Colorado, meeting. Dr. Cary will explain the core curriculum of Poston at the conference.

Dr. John Rowell, Dir. of Adult Ed. will present the Poston High school program. Dr. Cary has enlisted the aid of Miss Custman, Miss Manning, Miss A. Peavey, Miss Morrison, Mr. Ogawa, Mr. De Sylva, Mr. Sosnowski, and Dr. Harris to compile data on the educational program in Poston.

## EVACUEE PROPERTY OFFICER WITH SACRAMENTO PROBLEMS

R.W. Schmitt, the Evacuee property Officer has arrived at Poston and has opened offices in Room 25 Ad. Bldg., Unit one. Arrangements will soon be made to have representation in Unit II and III. Coming from Sacramento with a good knowledge of conditions in all Central California, he will be very helpful to the former residents of that area.

Mr. Schmitt acted as Property Officer for the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco in the Sacramento area for several months during the evacuation period.

Assistance will be provided in handling problems of management, operation and disposition of real and personal property or in settling claims held by evacuees. In this work the Evacuee Property Office representative will have the cooperation of the Project Attorney.

The decision to have an Evacuee Property Office representative stationed here came as a result of the uncertainty in handling outside property matters. The Chronicle will print several articles setting forth the services which the Evacuee Property Office is able to render and what information residents will be required to furnish in order to avail themselves of this service, which will be free to them.

## SANTA FE ASKS FOR 900 EVACUEE WORKERS

Immediate need for 900 laborers from Poston between the ages of 18 and 55 to relay steel and surface tracks on the Santa Fe Railway Co. lines in Eastern Kansas was announced yesterday by the Employment Office.

Rate of pay is 50¢ per hour 8 hours per lay. Evacuee labor will receive the same rate of pay, will work under the same rules and regulations, and will be afforded the same privileges as all employees of the same classification.

Representatives of the company will be in the Center until April to confer with residents. Railway officials here at present are C. S. Cravens, assistant general manager of Santa Fe; T. C. Brown, labor superintendent; and Fred F. Phillips, superintendent of special services.

Other jobs may be opened later, Cravens reported.

## Leave Procedure Explained

Evacuees leaving the Project on seasonal, short term or indefinite leaves, according to A. W. Empie, Chief Administrative Officer, will be required to comply with the following instructions before final clearance can be issued:

On approval to leave the Project you will go to the Leave Office where you will be given a property clearance form. This clearance certificate must be signed by the employer, Blk. Mgr. and Blk. Mgr., Supervisor, and the Property Custodian. All property must be accounted for.

Evacuees leaving by bus, train, or private conveyance will also be required to bring their hand baggage, etc., to the Poston Express Depot for inspection. Such baggage must reach the depot at least four hours prior to departure.

## COUNCIL OKAYS RECOMMENDATIONS

Unit Two's Community Council approved the recommendations of the Merit Rating Board on reclassifications of the Work Corps members under WRA Instruction #27 Tuesday night in a special session.

The administrative instruction provides the procedure to reclassify evacuee workers for Group "C" Classification which states, "Jobs involving responsible supervision of the work of another employee; jobs requiring professional training; jobs making an exceptional contribution to project operation entailing extremely hardwork essential to the welfare and morale of large numbers of people or which involves exceptional skill."

The recommendation will be submitted to Project Director, W. Wade Head and will ben-

efit following additional departmental workers: (1) Health & Sanitation: Clinic, Public Health; (2) Sub-sistence: Administration, Mess Halls; (3) Transportation & Supply: Motor Operation, Warehouse; (4) Security; Fire Dept., Internal Security, Life-guards; (5) Agriculture; (6) Leave Office; (7) Employment; (8) Administration: Administration Offices, Community Council, Fair Practice Board, Block Managers; (9) Maintenance: Building, Public Utilities; (10) Fiscal Dept.; (11) Education; (12) Manufacturing (Industry).
