WRA projects must account for processed foods, coffee and sugar under rationing regulations of the Office of Price Administration now in effect, the Steward's department declared yesterday.

Chief Project Steward Snelson emphasized the fact that processed food will be issued to the mess halls upon the same basis as that

Commenting on the efficiency of the Poston General Hospital during his recent stay there, C.E. Snelson, Project Steward, stated that it would do credit to any city the size of Poston.

He praised the willingness of the people working in the wards, often doing unaccustomed tasks with determination and cheerfulness. "It makes one feel that these people will carve their rightful place in the world yet, and of course this is what the WRA intends them to do," he said. Calling George Neeno an "indefatigable worker from Brawley," he also commented on the cheerful efficiency and skill of the ward head nurse, Mary Yamagata.

He was pleased, he said, to have been treated as a regular inmate of the institution rather than to have received favors because of his position. He observed that the hospital diet was adequate.

used in civilian rationing, namely, 48 points per person for each five-week period. Sugar will be issued on the basis of one and one-half pounds for ninety meals.

To safeguard issues of these foods, it will be the duty of the Chief Steward to inform the rationer of the processed foods, coffee and sugar, the exact amounts to be issued to each mess hall.

Rulings on special diets state that processed foods, coffee and sugar will be supplied to the hospital of pharmacy only upon written request signed by the Project Chief Medical Officer, stating specifically the reasons for the request.

At intervals to be designated later, the project will forward to the Washington Office of the WRA, a report on the number of meals served on the project.

This report should be based on project strength as indicated by the weekly census directed in Administrative Instruction No. 47.

The reports should be prepared by blocks, in order that the proper number of points may be allotted to each mess hall upon the basis of block population.

The Chief Steward will also report the project strength together with the number of meals served, the ruling explained.

LAUNDRY SOAP FROZEN

All laundry soap, cake, flakes and granulated, will be frozen until further notice, the C. E. disclosed yesterday. This action was necessitated due to limited supply on hand.

The soap will go on sale again when an additional shipment arrives, at which time soap will be sold as previous on a ration system.

The freezing will not affect face soap.
