## POSTON BIRTH NUMBER 231

Since the Colorado River Relocation Center was opened May 10, 1942, for the evacuees, 231 births have been recorded at Poston to March 31. The total for this year from Jan. 1 to the end of March stood at 78, 38 males and 41 females. The average monthly birth rate is 26. In the past month of March 23 births, 12 male and 11 females were recorded.

On the other side of the ledger, the death rate for 1943 numbered 26, 17 females and 19 males.

## FARM TOOL LOCATIONS SOUGHT

An appeal was made recently for all persons knowing the whereabouts of the idle Japanese-owned farm machinery that is stored throughout Southern California, to notify Harry Oakley, area representative of the WRA, the LA Times reported Thursday.

Mr. Oakley explained that his office is working in cooperation with the War Production Board and the State Dept. of Agriculture in locating the much needed farm equipment that was left behind by the evacuees.

## ADMINISTRATOR UNUS HONORED AT FAREWELL SOCIAL

In a beautiful patriotic setting of red, white and blue and a large American flag draped against the wall, 200 persons, appointed persons and evacuees, attended a farewell social held in honor of John Evans, Unit I Administrator and his family, given by the Blk. Mgrs. last Friday evening at Mess 32.

With Franklin Sugiyama acting as the Emcee, the harmonious party was opened with the singing of the patriotic song "God Bless America," followed by the speech given by the emcee.

Principle speakers at the evening were George Kurata, Chrmn. of the Public Relations Dr. Mizushima, Issei Advisory Board member; Tom Sakai representing the Blk. Mgrs. and Chief of Police K. Shigekawa all whom praised Mr. Evans' work. The Honoree responded and said he regrets leaving Poston.

The latter part of the evening was devoted to entertainment which was given by evacuees and Appointed Personnel. The highlight of the entertainment was a song by C. K. Nelson, "I Wish I Was Single Again," which was facetiously dedicated to his wife.

The affair was highly successful.

W. Wade Head yesterday stated emphatically that, that does not necessarily denote that the other project works, such as agriculture, construction, etc., will be relegated to any "unimportant" level.

"Our principal aim for the next few months," he said, "will be concerned primarily with the resettling of as many residents as possible into the normal channels of American life. But we must also face the fact that there will be thousands of evacuees who will remain in the Center for the duration. Therefore, we must continue with our plans of developing the resources of this center so as to be as self-sustaining as possible."

This statement was made to clarify the many erroneous impressions held by residents concerning the "folding-up" of some of the center's projects to facilitate the leave clearance procedures. While every effort will be made to expedite the work of the leave clearance and employment departments, no "essential" departments will be hindered unnecessarily in carrying out their program.

Project Director W. Wade Head returned to Poston earlier in the week from Washington where he visited on an official business.

## "Ataloa" To Appear Tonight In Unique Indian Folklore Program At 210 Campus Club

Ataloa, Chickasaw Contralto, appears here under the auspices of the Education Department and the Com-

munity Activities.

She is an authority on Indian culture and she re-creates age-old dances, songs, legends and religious ceremonies of different tribes. Those who have seen and heard Ataloa previously were enraptured with the beauty, sincerity and simplicity which characterizes her lectures and concerts.

Her program tonight will create a deeper understanding of the spiritual and esthetic values in the Indians' contribution to American civilization.
