

## PROJECT DIRECTOR APPROVES ENGINEERS PAY INCREASE

Project Director W. W. Head's approval of 185 members of R.H. Rupkey's engineering staff for \$19.00 per month by virtue of the Man Power Commission's recommendation was greeted with favorable comment by the TCC I at their weekly Sat. meeting held at the Adult Education Hall in Blk. 36.

Before an appreciative and capacity crowd Ataloea ("Little Song") presented an unique program of music and Indian lore at the 210 Campus Club Saturday evening. She was accompanied at the piano by Mme. Michael Sosnowsky. Her appearance locally was sponsored by the Educational department through the efforts of Mrs. Grace Burrell and the Community Activities.

Ataloea gave her audience a deep insight to the Indian's conquest of beauty in every phase of life. School children as well as the adults were fascinated and delighted with her presentation.

Those who studied her expression found the incomparable distillation of hundreds of years of culture and philosophy. Through her varied numbers, the audience heard the exquisite music of a mother singing a lullabye, a mating song, a song of thanksgiving. She also rendered tribal melodies. Cadman's familiar and haunting, "By the Waters of Minnetonka," was perhaps the most popular of her numbers.

Her magnificent voice and superb artist-

ry won a continued success of ovation.

In several of the melodies Ataloea used the tom-tom which accented the height and depth of the sheer poetry of Indian music.

Statuesque Ataloea was attired in a colorful costume of Spanish influence, featuring 3000 pieces which made up the gown which thread was made of a "white man's" material.

Ataloea explained that her costume was a symbol of "An Indian is still an Indian," she said, "and there's something that's never been conquered which belongs to the Indians and belongs to the Americans." Lovely beads and Indian jewelry accented her costume.

 TODAY'S QUOTE: ~~Said~~ Senator Chandler (D), Kentucky, in Washington, "From 40 to 50 percent of the Japanese males of military age have replied 'no' to an Army question as to whether they are loyal to the United States. These cannot be given complete liberty, and, as many of them are American citizens by birth, the constitutionality of consigning them at labor in concentration camps may arise.

Second, we will not send the Japanese agriculturists where they are not wanted. They cannot return to their homes on the West Coast, whence they were evacuated by the Army for security reasons.

The logical field for them is the Middle West, and we are curious as to whether Middle West farmers will take them.

We hope so. The farmers may rest assured that all Japanese who leave the relocation centers will have been "screened" by the F.B.I. so that every one liberated will bear certification that he is harmless"...End quote.
