



PROJECT TO ISSUE LEAVE PERMITS

CO-OP CONGRESS TO TAKE STEPS

FOR INCORPORATION

The Poston Co-operative Congress decided to take immediate steps for the final incorporation of the existing Community Enterprise, it was announced yesterday in a "report to the public". A membership drive and election of a new Co-operative Congress by members on a block basis will be held as soon as the Charter of Incorporation arrives, it was explained, as the last obstacles were cleared.

Three reasons for the delay in the long anticipated change from Community Enterprise to a Consumers Co-operative were presented in the statement issued by the board of trustees of the Co-op Congress. Briefly the obstacles were:

A ruling by the War Relocation Authority that a clause in the compromise Trust form of Co-op organization was contrary to the general policy of the WRA; delay in the auditing of the Community Enterprise and the necessity for a reorganization of the accounting system; negotiations undertaken to reduce the rental fee of the WRA, and oppose the charging of clothing allowances for dependents of employees.

All three obstacles have been cleared, the report explained.

STREAMLINING OF CLEARANCE PROCEDURE ACCLAIMED AS IMPORTANT STEP TOWARD SPEEDING WRA RESETTLEMENT PROGRAM

The Project will issue indefinite leave permits under specified circumstances where clearances have not yet been granted, beginning this Monday, Project Director W. Wade Head announced yesterday.

Administration personnel and residents acclaimed the newest revisions in the leave procedure as an important step toward an acceleration of the resettlement program. Previously, indefinite leaves were issued only after clearances had been received from Washington.

Machinery to handle the anticipated increase in the volume of indefinite leaves has been established by the Leave Office, Mr. Head reported. Forty persons a day can now be processed.

In addition to a bona-fide job offer approved by the WRA or evidence of other means of support, issuance of leave permits for departure from the center is contingent on eight conditions:

- 1) Registration for leave clearance either on selective service form 304A and form WRA 126a, or on form WRA-126 (rev.), during the special registration in February and March;
- 2) An unqualified affirmative answer to question 28 in the registration;
- 3) Not applied for repatriation or expatriation;
- 4) Not a paroled alien;
- 5) Not a Shinto priest;
- 6) No denial or suspension of leave clearance applications;
- 7) Assurance of loyalty and certainty

RUNDQUIST SPEAKS IN UNIT II ON RESETTLEMENT

Under the auspices of the Committee on Resettlement of Japanese Americans, the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America, Home Missions Council of North America and the Foreign Mission Conference of North America, George Rundquist, executive secretary of the Committee on Resettlement addressed an audience numbering more than 100 Friday night at the 214 Mess Hall.

Mr. Rundquist stated that the longer the evacuees remained in the Centers, the less one is able to face realities and skills become unproductive. "I'm not concerned about the taxpayers' money and the fancy price you're making them pay. You are also making us pay a fancy price in Democracy."

The speaker has traveled widely to educate the residents in the middlewestern states creating favorable opinions for the resettlement of the American citizens of Japanese ancestry. In majority of the cases, Rundquist said that the people were curious of the evacuees and were willing to meet and associate with any of them.

As far as employment

was concerned the speaker emphasized that the WRA employment officers were doing admirable work in creating job opportunities. The most important thing in obtaining employment for the evacuees is always to get the prevailing wages.

Mr. Rundquist related incidents where resettled evacuees have paved a successful way for future resettlement of Postonians and other Center residents to be relocated in the eastern cities. He said, "If you hope to return to your former homes and some of you do, you can only do so by developing a strong public opinion in your favor. The only way to get that is by helping us to get acquainted with you."

CHRONICLE REPORTER TOURS UNIT 3 CAMOUFLAGE FACTORY

The Camouflage workers of Poston 3, some 135 of them working on 10 separate teams, have been compared with the money mad shysters of all time, when they recently demanded and got a 5% hike in their percentage of the "take", but don't you believe it. It's not all honey and molasses but, if you think otherwise, Mr. Hisao Chiba, the Superintendent who took us through the plant Wednesday, will gladly do the same to you, or, better still, he'll give you a job there and you can go through what the workers are going through everyday; the terrific heat, the dust and a smell that reminds you of Oakland's approach to the San Francisco Bay Bridge and, if you're not the right type, rashes that will swell your face up and close your eyes so tight you could hardly see out of them. Believe me, it's no picnic but, I can't, for the life of me, see why any of them want to risk all that for the kind of money they're making.

As for the controversy of the workers and the council over the "take", we aren't taking sides. Both must have their points and we're not sticking our neck out, either way, we'll remain neutral and when the battle is over, we'll help pick up the pieces and the bodies but that's all.

A fast crew, in spite of the terrific heat, dust, lint and smell, will hit 2,000 square feet a day and that's \$9.60, which ain't hay, if you can get all of it, which you don't. A new crew averages from a thousand to 1200 square feet a day, which is anywheres from \$4.80 to \$5.76, and you don't get all of that either.

Let's take the fast crew first, and chop his \$9.60 down: From the \$9.60 must come \$1.00 for subsistence which goes to the WRA; 48¢ for victory tax and 10¢ for Social Security, which leaves \$8.02. 65% of that is \$5.21 which goes to the worker and the balance of \$2.81 goes into the pot.

Take a new crew that averages 1200 square feet a day (They usually don't do that well) and that's \$5.76. A buck for subsistence; 29¢ for Victory Tax and 6¢ for Social Security leaves \$4.41. 65% of that nets the worker \$2.87 and the pot gets the balance of \$1.54. Nobody's getting rich, except maybe the contractor.

Chiba took us through the factory Wednesday and honestly, I never saw 135 people work so hard anywhere and I've looked at a good many of them in my time. Tamaki Shiozawa, the school teacher; Frank Takahashi, the tractor driver; Kelly Yamada, from the Clinic; Harry Hiratsuka and Pete Akahoshi, out of rec; Frankie Yamane, out of the Canteen; Roy Yamane, out of the Sign Shop; Mrs. Hibi, the council woman; Jack Ota the ex-block manager--you wouldn't know they were the same bunch that sat and slept through their \$16.00 and \$19.00 a month jobs for 8 months.

Sure, they're making more money and \$5.00 is a long ways from 80¢ a day, but look at what

they have to go through. Look at Mickey Yemoto and Ben Furuta and George Takayama, Tak Takanishi, Frankie Tsutsumi and Henry Kiyomura and others too numerous to mention. They couldn't stand it and had to give it up. The place isn't lousy with workers who gave up essential jobs to satisfy their greed for more dough. Yes, there are 135 of them but look at the risk they're taking and 135 out of more than 4,000 isn't too much.

The place is long and narrow and about as cheerless as the prospects of the worker hiking their take to 100%, and the heat is terrific. The heat opens your pores and the lint and dust gets into your system and if you can take it, fine. If you can't you might as well get the hell out of there, and fast, too. Because if you get rashes from handling the dyed bur-lap, that's all there is to it; you'll get it no matter what you or anyone else can do, and, you might as well try something else.
