"Hub" Metropolis of Arizona Will Exceed Manzanar,
Rivers, Newell and Others

SAN FRANCISCO, June 14. (Special)--Poston, soon to be the second largest city of Arizona, is also destined to become the largest of all the evacuation centers, it was stated at the War Relocation Authority headquarters here today.

The "Hub" Metropolis by the side of the Colorado River, eventually will have a total population of 20,000. Newell,--new town to be created at Tule Lake, Calif.,--will be second in population, with 16,000, and other evacuee centers, with their populations, are to be as follows:

Everyone in Poston should be acquainted with all the poisonous insects and reptiles so they may avoid them, and also know what to do in case they are bitten.

The scorpion is the most common and plentiful of the pests. It may be easily distinguished by its resemblance to a shell-less crab. It has two forward pinchers, three pairs of appendages, and a rather long tail in which the stinger is located. Their color varies from light orange to blue-green. They are found in dark, moist places such as under wet sacks and boards. However, the scorpions are not too poisonous.

Another of the pests is the Kissing bug. They are nocturnal insects which like to suck blood from their victims. The pain comes from welt that is formed where the blood was extracted. If many of these bugs bite you it is likely to cause serious trouble.

The Gila Monster belongs to the lizard family and has the distinction of being the only poisonous lizard in the world. It's color is bright salmon and black. However, not many of these reptiles are habitants here.
