

## EXTRA RICE RATION FOR POSTONIANS

The Steward's Dept. disclosed yesterday that extra carloads of rice totaling 154,000 lbs has been secured to boost the rice ration for the evacuees. A total of 55,400 lbs is due this week and the distribution of the extra rice will be on a proportion basis. This is two sacks more than the regular delivery to each kitchen. It is the policy of the Steward's Dept. to send out rice considered surplus over and above the regular requirements for 30 days.

In connection with the Blk. 44 mess hall, Project Steward, C.E. Snelson said, "Arrangements had been made by his department to feed the unfortunate 252 residents of Blk. 44 at Mess halls 37, 38, 43." Steward Snelson emphasized that the Blk. 44 food rations are being divided among the 3 host kitchens and that the people of those blocks should not feel that the people of 44 are eating at the hosts expense. "We are sure the kitchens playing hosts to the less fortunate neighbors will make the new comers in their dining room happy" he further stated. Chicken will make its first appearance on all Poston dining tables on Easter Sunday. The Agriculture Dept. has 1200 birds averaging 3 lbs. each which it will kill and pick the birds making them ready for delivery to the kitchens. The cooking staffs will do the rest. ## 500 LBS FREIGHT ALLOWED EVACUEES FOR LEAVE

Evacuees cleared for indefinite leave are allowed government transportation of household effects in amount of 500 pounds per family, John G. Hunter, Assistant Leave Officer, in charge of freighting arrangements announced today. Freight in excess of 500 pounds must be transported by other arrangements, it was pointed out.

Requests for transportation of property must be accompanied by indefinite leave clearance, Hunter said. ## TEMPORARY COMMUNITY COUNCIL VOTES TO JOIN CENTRAL FUND

In a special session called Tuesday afternoon as a result of the arguments presented by the Unit One and Unit Three TCC in the Monday meeting, the Poston Two Temporary Community Council voted to join the Central Trust Fund of Poston.

Franklyn Sugiyama, chairman of the Unit I TCC, made the pleas to the Council group to join the fund in order to prevent any friction among the thousands of workers in Poston One for subsistence, maintenance, hospital department for the welfare of the three units.

The central trust fund plan was rejected by the Unit II Council previously when unit wage scale for the net garnishing workers had not been set.

In the course of the Monday session when representatives of the 1 and 3 councils gave their argument for the central trust fund, chairman Dr. Frank Ito and John Nakamura responded that Unit 2 council was in no position at the time to give either a negative or positive answer.

Representative Frank Fukuda expressed his opinion that "he shudders to think what will happen if people of Unit I refuse to serve the people of Unit 2 their subsistence, hospital service, etc.; he shudders to think what will happen if present conditions (of split trust fund) were to be carried out."

Upon such ear-splitting remarks of representative Fukuda, chairman Ito called a special session of the council Tuesday, at which time they voted to join the Central Trust Fund, as of April 1, 1943.
