

WRA DIRECTOR HAS BUSY DAY AT POSTON

Dillion S. Myer, Director of the War Relocation Authority, appeared before various groups and presented the key address at the Poston Educational Conference yesterday, during his brief visit at the Colorado River War Relocation Center.

The distinguished visitor, who was accompanied by Phillip Glick and Robert Cozzens, arrived here Wednesday evening and left on Thursday afternoon.

Mr. Myer's busy program at Poston included a talk before the Community Councilmen at Unit I, a tour through the three units in the morning, a press conference with representatives of the Poston Chronicle after lunch, and the address at the Educational Conference.

NELSON REPLACES EVANS AS UNIT I ADMINISTRATOR

CIVIL SERVICE

PROCEDURE REVEALED

Procedure for applying for Civil Service positions was outlined by John A. Twerek from Phoenix Civil Service office on his visit to discuss the possibility of employing evacuees in government offices throughout the States.

As outlined, the regional Civil Service office will supply the Center with a list of jobs now available. Applicants may submit their applications through the unit employment offices for any of these positions for which they are qualified. The application will then be sent to the regional office in which the position is open and it will be processed there.

Twerek reported that approximately 99 per cent of Civil Service appointments did not necessitate a written or an oral examination. However, in a few instances, tests are required.

The only requirement other than Civil Service prerequisite is that the person be eligible for indefinite leave before he applies for Civil Service appointment.

The Employment Division has requested the lists of jobs available from the regional offices located outside the Eastern and the Western Defense Commands which are expected so on.

Len Nelson, former Executive Assistant to the Project Director, took over the administration of Unit I, following his appointment by W. Wade Head. He replaced John Evans who was promoted to another government agency and is expected to leave the project in the near future.

In a memorandum issued yesterday by Mr. Head, each department was reminded that all documents, requisitions, and other papers which formerly required Mr. Evans' signature for authorization will bear the signature of Mr. Nelson.

Mr. Head declared that he felt sure that the newly appointed Administrator can count on the full support and cooperation of the entire administrative staff in the performance of his duties.

As Executive Assistant, Mr. Nelson was recently in charge of the issuance of shoe rationing cards for the entire project.
