

## NEW WORK PLAN PRESENTED NET FACTORY MGR.

Following conversation and discussions among the crew leaders of the net factory recently in reference to the working agreement for the weaving of the 12' x 12' new size raw net, the following agreement was presented to Walt Bilicke, factory manager, by Henry Odagawa, elected spokesman for the crew leaders:

1. One crew of weavers shall work on Sat., May 1st, to make patterns. All others shall work from Mon., May 3rd.

2. All discarded strips to date shall be salvaged and the usable ones shall be woven into the above nets, excepting extra wide, narrow, or short strips.

3. The weavers shall reef their own nets after spreading and passing inspections. This shall pertain only to the nets above mentioned.

4. Registration of weaving crews shall be open until close of Fri., April 30th and no additional crews shall be employed by the management until the above nets are garnished, provided there are at least 120 weavers daily employed and at no time during this agreement shall the total number of weavers exceed the total number of weavers employed at the close of April 30th.

5. All other clauses of working agreements pertaining to the camouflage project shall be as stipulated in the latest 1943 agreement between the workers and the management.

The War Department is carrying out all of the promises made in connection with its plan for organizing the Japanese American combat team, Colonel William P. Scobey of the General Staff declared in a communication issued on April 21 to the Community Council.

## C.E. ACCEPTS RATION STAMP #17

According to the last report from the Project branch ration board, No. 17 stamps, which were returned by the mail order houses in case of unfilled orders, are now accepted by the C.E. stores, provided they are accompanied by a form letter of transmittal. Other certificates which have been exchanged for new No. 17 stamps, small grey stamps which are slightly larger than the No. 17 stamps, from the War Ration Book No. 1, are also acceptable.

Residents leaving Poston who were issued ration stamps may purchase shoes at the C.E. stores prior to leave, with those which are dated subsequent to March 15.

The proposal to form a Japanese American combat team as announced by the Secretary of War on January 28, continues to be the policy regardless of what any subordinate commander has said or may say, Colonel Scobey affirmed. He pointed to the removal of restrictions against Japanese American soldiers traveling on furlough into the prohibited area of the Western Defense Command as an indication of the good faith in the War Department's policy.

Colonel Scobey urged loyal Japanese Americans to have faith in the people of high official capacity who have the Welfare of the Nisei at heart and who are untiring in working for their interest. He stated:

"It is my hope that this fact will not be overlooked by them and that they will keep it in mind they should not let their friends down by failing to maintain faith in the final outcome."

At the Tuesday morning meeting of the block managers Unit II Postmaster Masanobu Miyazaki revealed that since the establishment of the post office, they have transacted approximately \$250,000. worth of business, and shortages in funds are bound to occur.

### MANPOWER SHORTAGE DISCUSSED AT COUNCIL MEETING

Manpower shortage in several vital department, namely the Fire Dept., Subsistence Warehouse and hospital were discussed at a meeting of the Community Council, Wednesday morning.

A request for aid from the council in securing young men immediately for the Unit III Fire Dept. was made by Fire Chief Evans but six of the men have left or are leaving for outside employment or have volunteered for the Army, Evans revealed.
