VOLUNTEERS TO LEAVE

FIRST CONTINGENT OF 45 TO DEPART ON MONDAY FOR INDUCTION AT SALT LAKE CITY

THE FIRST CONTINGENT OF FORTY-FIVE VOLUNTEERS FOR THE JAPANESE AMERICAN COMBAT TEAM WILL LEAVE POSTON BY TRAIN ON MONDAY, MAY 10, PROJECT DIRECTOR W. WADE HEAD ANNOUNCED TODAY. THEY WILL BE INDUCTED AT SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH.

NAMES OF THE VOLUNTEERS IN THE INITIAL GROUP WERE NOT AVAILABLE AT PRESENT, MR. HEAD STATED, BUT INDIVIDUALS WILL BE NOTIFIED AS SOON AS THE LIST IS RECEIVED THIS WEDNESDAY OR THURSDAY FROM MAJOR CHARLES C. BACKES IN PHOENIX.

A TOTAL OF 233 YOUNG MEN HAD VOLUNTEERED FROM POSTON FOR THE SPECIAL JAPANESE AMERICAN COMBAT UNIT WHEN THE CALL TO COLORS WAS ISSUED. RE-EXAMINATION HAS BEEN PROMISED THOSE WHO HAD BEEN REJECTED AT THE PRELIMINARY PHYSICAL SCREENING CONDUCTED HERE, AND THE WHOLE GROUP STOOD READY TO ANSWER THE INDUCTION ORDER.

AFTER INDUCTION, THE VOLUNTEERS WILL BE GIVEN A WEEK'S FURLOUGH. LATER THEY WILL GO TO CAMP SHELBY, MISSISSIPPI, WHERE 2,500 SOLDIERS FROM HAWAII ARE ALREADY IN TRAINING.

AG. TRACTOR DRIVERS "WALK-OUT" CAUSES STAND-STILL

It was disclosed by Frank Mizusawa, Dept. head, that 15 tractor drivers are urgently needed due to the recent walkout staged by the tractor drivers, in sympathy with complaints filed by the Labor Relation Board against Masa-ichi Sakata, foreman.

The walkout has caused complete "standstill" in the Truck Crop Div. for indefinite time until further employment of drivers are conducted. Although no information leading to settlement among the workers was revealed, it was stated that Sakata is currently working on the Hog project. The workers feel that complaint filed against Sakata as unqualified personnel is unjust since they believe he is well qualified for the job.

The source of the complaint filed was not revealed by the Labor Relation, but a strong undertone is believed to have been developed through verbal conversation, not through official written statement by the Dept. head. Homer Matheisen, Bill Sharp and Tsuboi stated that they filed no complaints in written form upon hearing conducted by the Labor Relation, which is contrary to the policy of the Board to conduct hearings or file complaints without the official written complaint.

Through unofficial channel it was revealed that Frank Fukuda member of the Labor Relation, was formerly from the Ag. Dept. but left the dept. due to misunderstanding. He is in charge of the present complaint filed by the Board. There seems to be a strong

NEW NOTARIAL FEES ANNOUNCED

In order to reimburse the cost of getting a commission as a notary public which is paid by private fund, it has been necessary to make charges for notarizing, according to Acting Project Attorney Thomas Masuda.

To avoid confusion in the future as to the charges made by the Legal Depts. of the three Units, notarial fees will be as follows:

- (A) No charges will be made for notarial works for evacuees and members of the Armed forces.
- (B) For Appointed Personnel, a flat charge of 50 cents per person, regardless of number of instruments.
- (C) For anyone not connected with the Project, the regular legal rates.

This schedule of fees will be enforced until the cost of the appointments of the notary publics has been fully covered.

Raymond Booth, Placement Officer for the W. R. A. in Cincinnati, reported more job offers for evacuees when could be met at present. On the list were all sorts of opportunities including stenographers, chefs, farmers, gardeners and no end of requests for cooks.

A small group of Japanese Americans have secured good jobs and established excellent community contacts. Community reception is said to be very good.

Mr. Dale Okazaki, for the past 9 months, Block Manager of 316, hops out of the frying pan and into the fire. He replaces Kaye Watanabe, Assistant supervisor of Block Managers, who is leaving for outside employment ...In ordinary times, I doubt whether Okazaki would take the job, but these aren't ordinary times in 316. There seems to be a minor revolution brewing there; their kitchen crew, one of the best in Unit 3, have had to walk out and, they called in the cooking school to organize a new crew.

The way we get it, it happened this way: Paul Suyeda, the Chef, needed 3 more helpers and asked the block for volunteers, at \$16 a month, of course. They were recruited at a block meeting, but the 3 went home, slept over it and changed what passes for their minds. Attempts to secure others were unavailing...So, the kitchen threatened a walk out for April 30, hoping in this way to secure the needed helpers, but the bluff didn't work and the crew just had to walk out.

Well, 316 is losing a darn good block manager. He must be, to stand it for a whole 9 months. It's a standing joke in Poston 3 that there isn't a bigger sucker job than to be a block manager—it's a lot of grief and headache, the hours are long and the pay is only \$19, and you always have a lot of crabs coming in with their beefs...In my book, the best block manager and the least appreciated by his people, is Jay Nishida of 308; and Okazaki isn't very far behind.

COST OF LIVING IN CHICAGO
AREA REVEALED

For the convenience of those who expect to resettle in the Chicago area, the Unit 3 Leave Office released the following letter from Elmer L. Shirrell, WRA Relocation Supervisor of the Chicago area:

"Cost of living in Chicago has increased about 20% over the average cost of living from 1935 to 1939.

"In terms of dollars and cents the best figures we can give you are based on a budget at maintenance level for a manual workers family consisting of a man, his wife, a boy age 13, and a girl age 8. The Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates that on a basis of Dec. 1942 prices, it would cost such a family about \$.45 a month to live in Chicago. For this amount, they should be able to secure a 4 room apt. with bath, gas, and electricity; have a small radio, ice for refrigeration, a daily newspaper, and attend movies once a week. We want to emphasize that these figures are based on a budget for a manual worker's family at "maintenance" level. This is neither an official nor a recommended budget. It can be considered a minimum budget for a family of four.

People planning to relocate in Chicago may be able to use these figures as a basis for estimating their own expense according to the size of their families and their usual standard of living.

Resident of Centers should be assured that all jobs are forwarded at prevailing wages and that they can live on these wages in Chicago.
