

**REPATRIATION
REQUESTS
CHANGEABLE**

Questions concerning what an evacuee should do when he has changed his mind on repatriation are answered in new WRA instructions received at the center today, according to Project Director W. Wade Head.

Persons who have asked to be repatriated, or who have indicated acceptance or declination of repatriation as a result of lists of names submitted by the Japanese government, may change their requests by filing the proper form with the Project Director. Copies may be obtained at the Directors Office.

The War Relocation Authority cannot guarantee the exchange of evacuees applying for repatriation. It can only place the applications in the hands of the State Department for consideration in exchange negotiation.

ISSEI ELIGIBLE FOR OFFICE UNDER NEW RULING

Under Administrative Instruction #34, Supplement 2, dated April 19, 1943, all persons of 21 years of age or over shall be eligible to hold elective office, whether citizens or aliens.

Under this interpretation, officers elected under the new Constitution may be all Isseis. This will mean that hereafter there shall be no need for the Issei Advisory Board, because the Isseis may hold an elective office as councilman.

INVESTIGATION OF PRIVATE ENTERPRISES TO START

All business enterprises, except those operated by the Community Enterprises, shall be investigated, and if the facts warrant, charges will be filed through the police commission on private enterprise charges; it was announced today by the TCC I. The above and the following recommendations were passed by the TCC I in their regular meeting

UNIT 1 WEAVERS TO RETAIN ALL EARNINGS

After much discussion, the Council voted to change their decision of the 35% for the camouflage workers until the stock of 13,202 nets have been garnished, thus permitting the workers to retain the entire amount of their earnings during that period; it was decided at the meeting of the TCC I held Monday night, May 3, at Mess 13.

During this meeting, the Council appropriated \$130 to the library toward the purchase of encyclopedia's and text-books.

Outside workers, including the Parker camouflage warehouse workers, and others, who reside on the project, were recommended to pay to the Community Council's dividend fund for distribution to the entire work corp, 35% of their net earnings. Subsistence and taxes will be deducted from the gross income, then, the worker shall receive 65% of the balance, and the Council shall accept the remaining 35% for distribution.

The recommendation, that the lapidary (stone cutting and polishing) business now being conducted by the Community Activities Department, with Dr. Powell's permission, be transferred to the Community Enterprise after the Council Committee has checked the receipts and expenditures of the present operator, Mr. Niizeki, was passed.

Another recommendation, that was approved, stated that the Community Activities Department's request for \$500 expenditure be approved after the Community Enterprise pays that sum to the TCC I. (The Enterprise had authorized this expense some time ago in a trustee's meeting but a formal request was withheld because the Activities had never justified the grant).

During this time Hiroji Kamimura, who was selected by the Executive Board, was approved as the Issei block manager supervisor.

CENTRAL COAST IDENTIFICATION PROPERTY TO ARRIVE CARDS AVAILABLE FOR AIRMEN

Former Salinas and Watsonville residents will receive their household goods within a short time as they have left Watsonville April 29, according to a wire sent to Takeo Momita, Property Custodian, from the Evacuee Property Headquarter in San Francisco.

"Of interest to former residents of Southern California, particularly Imperial Valley, we would request that those that desire to have their furniture and household goods, please attend to it promptly, as the WRA transportation Division is now working in that area," stated R.W. Schmitt, Evacuee Property Officer.

Evacuees who were previously denied airman identification cards may now apply for them by making applications to the Civil Aeronautics Administration according to the Project Director's Office.

Anyone wishing further information are asked to contact the Legal Office in Unit 1.

DOG TAGS TO BE ISSUED

All dogs must have metal registration tags, according to a memo from the Public Health Department, read at the weekly block managers meeting Tuesday morning, May 4, in the Conference room.

Due to continual complaints from the residents in regards to a number of stray dogs in camp, the Public Health Department has decided to issue registration dog tags. All dogs previously reported will be issued metal tags.

It would be appreciated if the dog owners would report their dogs to the Public Health Department. There is no fee charged for the registration.

MORE CANTEEN WORKERS NEEDED

In order to serve the residents of Poston longer hours during the hot season and on Sundays, it was revealed by George Karo, general manager, twenty-five additional workers are needed immediately to establish night shift.

In addition to the canteen clerks, workers are needed at the warehouse and office works. With the cashing of checks for the evacuees by the C.E., which will demand more workers capable of handling cash. Applicants are urged to contact the main office immediately.
