

**MINIMUM NET
EARNING CAUSES
35% RETAINMENT**

An agreement has been reached between the POC I, the Trust Fund, and the Committee representing the workers at the camouflage net project, in which the Council and the Trust Fund waive all rights to participation in the earnings of all net workers at Unit I, until a new agreement is reached between the net workers and the camouflage factory.

Since at present the net workers are not able to meet the minimum wage scale earnings during the present period of working on the smaller 12 x 12 nets, 13,200 in number, a limited time was granted with the sole understanding that a bargaining for higher wages take effect: Resumption of work, other than that specified above shall automatically revert back to its former agreement and the 35% for the Trust Fund take effect.

Kiyoshi Shigekawa, Henry Odagawa, and Paul Izumida, representatives of the camouflage workers, stated that they are entitled to receive their whole amount, due to the fact that the possible maximum income will not exceed \$1.75 or \$2.00 a day. It was disclosed that the rate of production is two thirds less than before.

**OPINION RESEARCH CENTER
ESTABLISHED IN POSTON**

Poston residents will soon have a chance to air their views through the newly established Poston Opinion Research Center. This word comes from Harry Field, Director of the National Opinion Research Center at the University of Denver, Denver, Colo.

**WRA OFFICERS
VOCATIONAL
TRAINING**

Vocational training for 35 young people of Poston has been offered by the National Youth Administration through arrangement with the WRA, it was announced today by Giles L. Zimmerman, Chief of the Employment Division.

Training will take place at resident centers at Helena, Montana; Boise and Pocatello, Idaho; Casper, Wyoming; Salt Lake City and Provo, Utah; and Denver and Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Types of courses to be provided include auto mechanics, machine shop, sheet metal, arc welding, radio, clerical pool, mechanical drafting, industrial sewing, and wood work.

The courses vary in length from six weeks to three months. Selection of individuals to attend the training committee, with the assistance of Joseph Samler, supervisor of vocational retraining, WRA, Washington, who is expected in Poston on May 10.

Candidates for NYA training must be citizens of the United States, between 16 and 25 years of age. Applications should be submitted in letter form and will be taken at the high school offices in the three units.

"In any kind of government or community" says Mr. Field, "the voice of EVERYONE is far more important than the voice of any ONE person or special group. Public Opinion surveying, like the Gallup poll, is becoming a more and more valuable instrument in self-governing nations and communities. These surveys are widely accepted as the only way of knowing what all the people think in between elections.

"Because of Poston's unique situation, it is believed that local opinion surveys will be valuable to the community as a whole. Furthermore, worthwhile contribution should be made to the science of opinion measurement through new techniques and methods developed in the course of the Poston surveys.

"Opinion polling is based upon asking a representative cross-section or sample of Poston's total population impartially constructed questions. Thus, every individual is not to be interviewed in order to determine the total opinion. Individual opinions will be kept confidential and no names will be asked, however, results of surveys will be made public from time to time.

"Their academic and practical experience qualifies them to conduct surveys in Poston!"

Stated Project Director Head: "Opinion polling in Poston has my hearty endorsement. I do hope the residents will cooperate in this important project." Chairman Sugiyama of the Council, Chairman Mizushima of the Issei Advisory Board, the Executive Board, Block Mgrs., and various other groups and community leaders have given their full approval to opinion surveys in Poston.

The first survey, which will be conducted within a few days, will be on "Resettlement." A trained staff of evasive interviewers in assisting in the polling.

PLANNING COMMISSION DISCUSSES IMPROVEMENTS FOR COMMUNITY

The Planning Commission of the Temporary Community Council of Unit II Tuesday met with Administrator James D. Crawford to discuss and formulate plans to improve and begin construction on various points within the unit for the

benefit of the community, namely the Cottonwood Bowl, the city park, the churches, and others.

After their present project is finished, the tractors are scheduled to level the bowl area and to deepen the pit below the stage, similar to the plan drafted by the Agriculture Department.

The firebreak between blocks 214 and 219 is to be developed into the city park, with two 200-foot squares at the corners allotted for the Unit II churches. Church groups have been asked to determine the sizes of their churches.

The huge shelter in the center of the swimming pool has reached completion, as have the railings, life-guard towers, and fences. It has been promised that materials will be received soon to build spring boards, ladders, dressing rooms, and possibly other rooms.

It was noted that concrete pipes are at present in the process of being laid in various blocks for irrigation purposes to further dust control.

The Planning Board requested that all requisitions for construction, other than office and other improvement, be sent through this body.

Members of the board include Manabu Fukuda, chairman, Mr. Miura, Mrs. Kurato, Mr. Fukuhara, Mr. Ohara, and Mr. G. Ohara.

REVIEW:

S. GEORGE TAJIRI, ARTIST

On display this week until Saturday at the Poston School Central Library are the artistic works of S. George Tajiri, Unit Three artist.

The art-minded residents of this community are beginning to recognize youthful Tajiri as Poston's artist-of-the-year for his oil studies, ink brush sketches, and beautiful pastels in charcoal which are currently on exhibit, an especially interesting piece (to this reporter) is a charcoal pastel entitled "Dust Storm and the Pessimist". Tajiri's self portrait in oil is also strikingly done in deep, somber shades, with highlights of yellow. The sketches of Poston views are eye-catching in their frankness and clear-cut simplicity.

Art proved the anecdote for the long, empty hours during his convalescence from a prolonged illness, and in the summer of 1941, he attended WPA sculpturing classes in Balboa Park, San Diego. It was through his instructor, Ruth Ball, that he made the acquaintance of Donald

Hord, noted American sculptor. Hord, who made "Montezuma" at San Diego State College and the Civic Center statues, took an interest in Tajiri and insisted on instructing him, free, in sculpturing, drawing and painting. Dan Dickey, well known West Coast painter and friend of Hord, also encouraged the promising youth in his work. The future looked bright for Tajiri until his 18th birthday--Sunday, December 7, 1941.

At Santa Antia Assembly Center, Tajiri studied with Hideo Date and worked with several Disney men. In Poston, he worked with Isamu Noguchi, internationally known sculptor.

Now, a volunteer, he expects to soon join his brother, Staff Sergeant Vince Tajiri at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. His eldest brother, Larry, is editor of the "Pacific Citizen".

The "Galleries" at 210-14-D displaying pieces by S. George Tajiri, will be open to the public nightly from 7 to 9 p.m. until Saturday, May 8.

POSTON LAMPION

The Los Angeles Times, a smelly fish wrapper, we were suckers enough to subscribe to, solicits, encourages and prints, letters that fan hatred's flames against all people of Japanese blood. Following are some of the reader-editorials printed by the Times on these subjects, which was head lined, "Wrath against Japs."

This, from a Horse Doctor. "At a time when the whole country is aroused by the barbarity and savagery of the Japanese government, and at the same time filled with horror and loathing for anything Japanese, it would appear to be a proper time to consider the Japanese problem of the West Coast."

"My suggestion is that once we have brought Japan to an unconditional surrender and have completely disarmed her we should immediately deport all Japanese, whether of first, second or third generation."

"The question would at once arise: 'What about those who are now citizens and presumably loyal?'"

"My reply would be to take away their citizenship and send them back."

Here's another from a... "Now that the feeling is so bitter toward the 'SONS OF HEAVEN', I feel that it is a most opportune time to start the ball rolling toward a constitutional amendment which would cancel the citizenship of ALL persons of Japanese blood regardless of place of birth and deport them to what is left of Japan when MacArthur gets through with them."

"Mr. Ickes and a few more of his kind can associate with the SKUNKS but for me and millions of white men we will take our chances with the rattle-snake."

"As an old Californian who has been intimately acquainted with both nations and has seen their work, I can truthfully say there is no comparison between them (Chinese) and the Japanese termites who all too long have infested our shores."

Comments the L.A. Times: "The Times has no prejudice about color of skin or shape of eyes, but it most decidedly has a vigorous and growing distrust of the black hearts of the Japs, singly and collectively."

This, in answer to a Nisei's letter, protesting his loyalty to the United States: "The Times does not question the loyalty of some Japanese. It does, however, contend that it is impossible to distinguish between the loyal and nonloyal, and that for the good of everybody a system of detention is best." (Now, do you still want to go back to L. A.?-----Editor)
