EVACUEES TO ELECT NEW COUNCILMEN TODAY

In a recent public opinion survey conducted by the Opinion Research Center between May 8th and May 13th among the English-speaking residents of Poston over 18 years of age, it was revealed that 64% of this group are planning to leave Poston. The question and the actual results were:

"Are you planning to leave Poston?"

YES.....63%

NO.....28

UNDECIDED.....9

The biggest obstacle in the path of those who are desirous of leaving is lack of assurance of a job on the outside. 32% gave this as their answer to the question, "Is there anything that is holding up your plans to leave Poston?" 14% stated that family obligations were obstacles to their leaving immediately.

They replied that they had no problem and they were simply waiting for an opportunity. The rest (36%) of the people listed various other problems.

The 28% of the people who stated they did not intend to leave Poston were asked "What are your reasons for not planning to leave Poston to settle outside?" Family obligations, unfavorable sentiment on the outside, lack of parental consent, and no job assurance accounted for 67% of the reasons. These are listed in order from most to least frequent reply. Various other reasons made up the balance of 33%.

The same group of people who stated they did not intend to leave Poston were asked, "If all these problems facing you now were removed and you

PLAN DEVELOPED FOR OUTSIDE WORKERS

Project Leave Officer

Ralph Drenen reported today the development of a new plan which will make it possible for more evacuees to leave the center on indefinite leave in advance of receiving definite job offers.

Where a WRA relocation officer feels that he could place more people than are now coming into his area, he supplies the Project Leave Officer with information about the number of workers needed, the types of jobs open, wages, housing, cost of living, and other pertinent information about the community. The Project Director is then authorized to issue indefinite leave to evacuees whose skills seem to fit the request made by the relocation officer. Upon arrival in the community, evacuees will be helped by relocation supervisors and the local officer of the U.S. Employment Service to locate specific jobs.

Experience with hostels prompted WRA to develop this plan, it was learned. A wider range of employment opportunities is ordinarily available through personal interview on the spot. It is expected that any evacuated who leaves the center under this plan will secure employment within a few days.

With feelings running high in many blocks, Poston will again hold an election today to determine its councilmen to the new Local Council of each three units.

The abolishment of the TCC, which became effective under the new Constitution, necessitated this election, for which each block will elect one councilman to the Local Council.

Issei are eligible for the council, according to WRA instructions, which states that Issei are eligible to hold elective offices in the community.

The Local Council may enact regulations concerning only the internal affairs of its unit, provided the regulations are not inconsistent to the regulations enacted by the Community Council, according to the New Constitution. By any regulations, which the Community Council may seem detrimental to the general welfare of the Community of Poston, may be vetoed by the Community Council.

All voters must be eighteen years of age or over a resident of Poston for a period of four months, and even though having answered "no, no" to the 27th and 28th questions, they are still eligible to vote.

 were allowed to leave, should you consider leaving Poston to settle outside?" The result showed:

- YES.....67%
- NO.....18
- QUALIFIED ANS... 7
- NO OPINION..... 8

Those who stated they were planning to leave and those who stated they were not planning to leave were both asked "What do you plan to do when you leave Poston?" The result was:

- Seek job and live on the outside permanently.....55%
- Seek seasonal job and return to Poston when job is over..19
- Attend School.....10
- Other plans..... 8
- No Opinion.....10

The result of the survey were made possible through the voluntary assistance of eleven interviewers who represented various groups in the community. The Opinion Research Center, headed by Toshio Yatsushiro and Kwaio Ishino, sampled a typical miniature of the English-speaking population of Poston with the proper proportion of men and women, young and old, and other factors. A survey of the Japanese-speaking people will be conducted very soon. The Opinion Research Center wishes to express its deep appreciation to the eleven volunteer interviewers who made this survey possible.

現在日米人収容の十個所の戦時轉住所を廃止する案は屢々報じた通りヤンドラー、ムレー、面上院議員を首魁とする陸軍分科委員会の提唱であるが、同分科会調査團の過去六月に亘る熱心なる調査の結果及彼等の意見は各方面に重大なる影響を波及した。而して最初より斯かる意見を有したヤンドラーの公表せる論旨の要旨は
