

# NET FUND TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO EVACUEES

The Camouflage Dividend Fund will be distributed to all evacuee employees, who have worked the minimum of at least 15 days of the period covering the months of February and March, it was announced by the TCC I.

According to Plan I, which was voted upon as the most satisfactory by the residents of Unit I, a fund of \$5000 is to be donated to the hospital, 110 evacuee teachers to receive \$20 each, a donation of \$50 each to every block, and then after the above items are subtracted from the Camouflage Dividend Fund, amounting to \$17,863.66, the remainder of the money is to be distributed equally to all the evacuee employees.

The records of those eligible for the Fund will be secured from the Block Managers and then checked through the Timekeeping Department. Those persons, who had errors in their cash advances for the months of February or March, are requested to have adjustments made immediately with the Timekeeping Dept., in order to receive the Fund, if they have not already done so.

Any share of the Fund that is due to the individual camouflage worker, will be donated to the block fund in which the camouflage worker resides. Also the dividend, that is due to the people who have left Poston, shall be donated to the blk. fund in which the person resided, except in the case of a parent, wife, or husband, who is here, shall be eligible to receive their share of the dividend.

## UNIT I ELECTS 3 COUNCILMEN, NO CANDIDATES IN 3 BLOCKS

15 Issei and 16 Nisei, with five blocks still undecided up to the present time, have been elected to the local Council of Unit I for a term of one year; it was disclosed today by the TCC I, after the election returns had been thoroughly checked and rechecked.

Blocks 11, 11, and 53 did not hold an election as there were no candidates, with block 39 and 43 expected to check in their reports as this goes to press. Many blocks were appointed in February that some of their candidates were ineligible, as they had answered negatively to the 28th question.

These newly elected councilmen will be installed Thursday, May 27 with L.L. Nelson acting.

(3) obtain your individual time sheet from the department where you are working, signed by foreman or head of department. bring to timekeeping dept. with your release papers. official notice of leave from leave office must accompany to complete the final closing procedure in timekeeping dept. where extension of figures and signing of departee's signature are next in order.

Your individual time sheet is now ready for submitting to payroll dept. with the current evacuee's payroll list. departees are no longer placed on special check payroll.

米國下院議會は近來稀に見る激戦の後一九四二年度所得税を完全の除去する「ベイアズユー・エー」案を三一三対九五の大多數を以て通過上院に回附し、と華府電報報じたが、各自の給料から廿パーセントを保留するといふ小い同案が上院を通じ大統領の裁可ともなれ、七月一日の新会計年度から実施される。其の要旨は

(一) 軍人、牧師、家庭働、國勢働者を除く總ての係給生活者は家庭其他の免除残額の

二割を納入せねばならぬ。但し之は五%の戦勝税と所得税を兼ねるのである。

(二) 事業家、専向的業務者で給料によらざる所得者に年内に保留税を基礎とする概算によつて夫それ納税せねばならぬ。

(三) 農家に對しては特別現定が設けられ、總所得高は概算による所得の八割を下らざるべく斯かる者は十二月十五日以前に概算による所得税の申告書を提出せねばならぬ。

四年度のインカム・レタは現行通り三月十五日迄申告保而して之れによつて保留税或は見積税と真正の税額とを調査するものである。
