EMPLOYMENT DIVISION MOVES INTO EXPRESS BUILDING

The entire Employment Division established new quarters in what was formerly the Poston Express building, it was announced today. Located there will be the Leave Department, Outside Employment Department, Project Employment Department, and the Census Department.

PLANS CALL FOR CONSTRUCTION OF HALL

Hard surface floors for dancing, social activities and other community functions can be constructed in each unit, according to Dr. John Powell and R. H. Rupkey. The floors will be 40 x 100 feet, and materials are being transported to the Project's as transportation is available.

To build these floors it is necessary to have the services of 40 to 50 volunteer workers for about five days. The floors will be located at convenient places in each unit and will provide essential facilities for social activities and meetings during the last summer months.

Dr. Powell urged individuals and club groups to help in this work which will be of great benefit to the Project. Persons and groups who are interested should apply at the unit community activities offices.

The centralization of the various departments in the Employment Division had been long planned as a means of speeding up the processing of project and outside employment and leave clearances, it was declared, but housing facilities could not be arranged until the Express office left the building. It was pointed out that the Unit field offices will still be retained in their respective locations at Poston I, II and III.

A house warming party was held by staff workers Thursday afternoon. The Express office will be located at Blk. 15.

NURSING COURSE OFFERED IN MARYLAND

The Baltimore City Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland, is ready to accept 30 to 40 Nisei girls, preferably 19 to 35 years of age, as students in an one-year course for practical nursing; the Employment Division reported yesterday.

STUDENT RELOCATION DIRECTOR EXPECTED HERE SATURDAY

Thomas R. Bodine, field director of the National Student Relocation Council, is expected in Poston about Saturday for consultations with Nisei who have filed applications, Dr. Balderston announced yesterday. Others interested in continuing their education will have an opportunity to interview him as he will probably be here for a whole week.

MAY LEAVE FOR HOUSEWORK WITHOUT JOB OFFER

Residents interested in obtaining outside employment in the Chicago area as domestics are now permitted to depart on indefinite leaves without any particular offer of employment. A quota of three girls or women or two couples has been set to go out each week, without further approval from the Chicago WRA office. It was disclosed by the employment division today.

Only persons wishing to do domestic work and willing to stay with employers if conditions are satisfactory will be considered, it was emphasized. Relocation Supervisor Elmer L. Shirrell of Chicago stated that temporary housing will be arranged and applicants will be referred to suitable jobs.

Evacuee residents interested in the foregoing newly issued plan for domestic placement may apply at their respective Unit employment bureaus.

The Hospital provides during the course full board and residence, uniforms, laundry, medical care, and \$40 per month cash allowance.

RENEW SHOE CERTIFICATE IF URGENT

Residents are requested by the Rationing Board to refrain from renewing their shoe certificates if they are not in immediate need for shoes.

In the initial issuance of the certificates it was revealed that residents who are in need of shoes immediately were the only ones to apply for the certificates. The certificates may be applied for when needed for it does not require immediate renewal after thirty days validation has expired.

THE INDUSTRY INVESTIGATION LOOKS LIKE A BUST

The Community Council, the one that just expired, although 10 of the 16 members were returned to office; undertook an investigation some 5 or 6 weeks ago to trace down the "Excessive profits" the department's personals were supposed to be salting away. This was to have been the first of a series of cracking down by the body that would eventually drive out all private services and enterprises within the community.

Unfortunately, the investigation started on the wrong foot and there seem little chance of a home run. What was wrong?

Let us first look at the background. This investigation was to have been the most important of a whole series of crack down to be instigated by the Community Council.

Moreover, in calling for this investigation, the council is thought to have had a very shrewd maneuver in mind, the kind that ought to make all Poston III proud of them. But if the way they handled Wednesday's hearing is any criterion, this scheme seem doomed to fail. Old hands are laughing at the amateurishness of their technique.

To make an success of an important investigation there are certain tried procedures. First of all you make sure there is something to investigate, and also that there is some hope of reaching a decision. Then you assign experts--in this case, business specialists and accountants to the job. If you don't have business specialists and accountants available, they can surely afford to be humble enough to ask for help.

What was their procedure? Apparently they were so eager to hold an investigation that they forgot to figure out what it was supposed to find. But they went ahead anyway. Seized their books, took inventory and asked a lot of questions and came out with a report Wednesday that seemed hastily thrown together and it's cloudy language is an affront to the people.

So, the Council was thrown for a loss Wednesday and they're groggy, and it looks

as if Industry's Sim Togasaki and M. Harada has won the first round. Which isn't to say the whole investigation is going to wind up a bust. There is still the second round coming up Friday and it could be that the Council will come up with a score; but on the basis of what has come up so far, we have reasons to doubt.
