TCC BODIES FROZEN UNTIL HEAD'S ARRIVAL

Until further notice, the various bodies, which had been functioning under the TCC I, have been frozen to their offices, it was disclosed by Mas Kawasaka, Executive Board vice chairman.

In a memo, dated May 26, from Ralph Gelvin, Acting Project Director, to the TCC I, the six different bodies were asked as a personal favor from Gelvin to refrain from leaving their offices until the return of Wade Head, who at present is in Washington, D. C.

Under the regulations the terms of these bodies would terminate with the abolishment of the TCC I; but due to Head's absence, this is not practical to the community.

The bodies are the Executive Board, Labor Relation Board, Manpower Commission, Social Relations Bureau, Hospital Committee, and Police Commission.

Holding its initial meeting in the Conference Room, the 27 newly elected representatives to the Local Council (Unit I) were introduced and installed with Poston "formality" by Len Nelson, Oath Officer and Unit I Administrator.

Seichi Nomura of Blk. 45 and former vice chairman of the Unit I TCC was elected chairman to his disgust and accompanied by his remark "I was railroaded!" He was the only candidate for chairmanship.

The office of vice chairman was filled by Minoru Okamoto, Block 30, with Hideo Nakai, Block 27, elected as Sergeant-at-Arms.

The new councilmen, elected to represent Unit I in the Community Council, were Ono, Blk. 60; Nakai, Block 27; Iwatate, Block 22; Futakuda, Block 3; Sakai, Block 18; Okamoto, Blk. 30; Nakamura, Block 17; Hane, Block 16; and Kawasaki, Block 13.

Elected to the Judicial Commission were Elmer Yamamoto, Sugi, Block 5, and Nomura, who are subject to approval by Wade Head.

It was decided at the meeting to have Yukitaro Kawasaki represent the local Council at the Nurses' Aid Graduation, June 2 at 8 p.m.

Also the date of the weekly local Council meeting was decided upon to be on Wednesday afternoons at 1:30.

Mr. Kimball, who arrived here Tuesday, stated that he planned to remain in Poston for a few more days.

RED CROSS ALBUMS

**JUDICIAL COMMISSION
HEARS FUJINO CASE**

M. Fujino of Block 317 was arraigned before the Judicial Commission of Unit 3 on charges of operating a gambling establishment and for gambling.

Charges were read by Mr. Shirazawa, chairman of the Commission, who asked the defendant to enter his plea of guilty or not guilty, stressing that the defendant is allowed a week to answer to the charge. Defendant was granted a week's time.

If the defendant pleads not guilty next week when the court convenes on June 3rd, the trial will be held in the near future. However, if the party pleads guilty, the sentence will be passed on that day, according to the Administrative Instruction No. 85, Code of Offense.

Prosecuting attorneys were Elmer Yamamoto, Unit I and Kay Hamada, Unit III. Roy Koga acted as interpreter for the defendant.

Preceding the "Fujino Case", the Judicial Commission pronounced a leniency sentence on Tadashi Kawabata 308-7-D, charged with speeding. Kawabata, having pleaded guilty, was suspended for 10 days with warning for care in the future.
