Contrabands which are being released to the residents are mainly radios, which are not equipped with short wave receivers. Further details concerning the clarification of contrabands are expected from the U. S. Marshal.

VOLUNTEERS TO SPEED SCHOOL COMPLETION

ARKANSAS CENTERS IN NO DANGER OF FLOOD

In reply to a wire sent to the Rohwer and Jerome Centers in Arkansas by the Poston American Red Cross Chapter on May 26, concerning the many rumors that the Centers were being menaced by flood, Poston residents were assured that their relatives and friends are in no danger of being "flooded out."

The following wire was received from the Dermott Red Cross by Aijiro Takahashi, Chairman of the local chapter:

"Resident of Rohwer and Denson in no danger unless unforeseen changes in river prediction develop crest to reach both centers Sunday A.M. No cause to worry at present."

Foreseeing a possibility of completing the school project within the next two months or at least by the coming semester, the TCC I proposed a volunteer working plan and left the responsibility of working out the necessary details to the Labor Relation Board, earlier in the month.

After a thorough study of the manpower shortage, existing in Unit I, the Labor Relation Board completed a plan, whereby each block residents must volunteer to work at the school project on a certain day.

The only excepted workers are the hospital workers, warehouse subsistence, and cooks. So far the following blocks have gone: 3, 19, 14, 45, and 32, with 54 and 64 residents having volunteered from Blocks 3 and 19 respectively.

A combined anniversary service of Unit I will be held this Sunday, June 6, at the Blk. 5 Park at 8:30 pm according to the latest report, Sunday evening services hereafter will be held at the Blk. 5 Park.

POSTON III TOPS IN ADVANCEMENT

Due to the fine cooperation and help of the residents and the Block Managers, the Unit III block leveling has been finally completed making this unit; one of the top relocation centers in advancement and beauty.

"The delay in starting the actual leveling," Gerald Wumino, Assistant Administrator of Unit III, stated to the Chronicle, "could not be helped as we had to sell the idea to the workers first. However, once we sold them the idea, Mr. Rupkey, as well as Mr. Popkins and Cecil Basch of the Construction Department cooperated with us beautifully and helped rush the work through."

"The tractor drivers, of course, deserve full credit, too," Wumino stated.

Now that the blocks are completely leveled the project has turned to the construction of a swimming pool, adjoining the school grounds, which will be lined with cobblestones and be 60 feet by 150 feet, and the depth will be 10 feet.

A Dancing Pavilion will be constructed next to the pool and construction of an amphitheater has already started.

The project will construct in the school district, which is the old golf-driving range opposite the 310 Canteen, a track stadium, 3 tennis courts, softball fields and 4 basketball courts.

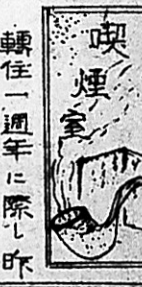
