# EVACUEES ADVISED FOR CIVIL SERVICE POSITIONS

Information reaching the Employment Division this week from Elmer L. Shirrell, relocation supervisor in Chicago, has indicated that a number of evacuees applying for Civil Service positions were asking for higher starting salaries than their qualifications warrant. Edward Nossoff, acting Chief of Employment, today advised applicants for Civil Service posts to exercise care in specifying a starting salary, basing his report on a conversation with a United States Civil Service Commission representative. Shirrell declared "There are too many applications being sent in from the Projects in which the lowest entrance salary that the evacuees will accept is too high or her educational and work backgrounds."

Shirrell pointed out that a person who states that he will accept only \$2600 per year will not be called for any position that pays less. "It is obvious", he said, "that if the Commission feels that on the basis of the

## FISCAL YEAR SUBSISTENCE REDUCED 35%, GELVIN

Beginning the new fiscal year, July 1, subsistence will be reduced by 35%, it was disclosed at the Poston Community Council meeting held in the Conference Room, June 3.

person's background, he does not warrant such a salary, his application will not be considered. Hence it will be dead."

had been sent in for the new fiscal year, which approximately amounts to only 31 cents per person per day, the above 35% reduction immediately brought forth a protest from the councilmen, who recommended an appeal be made.

A three men committee, composed of F. Fukuda (Unit I), Terakawa (Unit 2), Kadotani (Unit 3), was formed to draft a resolution to be sent to the Project Director and to the WRA.

The formation of an arbitration committee was unanimously approved, which would be composed of three members from Unit I and two members each from Units 2 and 3, in order to arbitrate issues arising before they are brought forth into court. Each Local Council of three units are to recommend their respective candidates, who then must be approved by the Poston Community Council. Any resident in Poston is to be eligible to be on the committee.

Thomas Masuda, Unit I attorney, was appointed as city attorney, by Chairman Nakamura, of Blk. 17.

## PLANNING BOARD SET WORKERS FOR POOL CONSTRUCTION

This is a report on the gathering at 310 Mess of the land planning board and their committees, which will have the thankless task of hunting up 40 to 50 workers daily to begin construction of the swimming pool, amphitheatre with a seating capacity of 3000, a dancing pavilion, and shower rooms. This is a thankless task because there are no available workers and the only possible out is drafting and that's always a ticklish problem.

Gerald Wumino explained the overall plan and George Yamatani, who is co-chairman, talked on manpower and the method of drafting and using high school juniors and seniors by securing cooperation of the school.

They throw a lot of wind around but some good points are brought up and they were: The idea of the whole project, the swimming pools for children and the young group, dancing pavilion for the jitterbugs, shibai stage and theatre for the older group, must be first explained and sold to the people, which is always a good idea. Get the people interested, and sold and they're going to back you---Try to cram it down their throat, and they will give you the back of their neck.

Another was that the people must be re-assured that they won't be given the boot around July and moved out of here, in which case, they would be building the whole project for the Indians, or whoever they put in here. This argument seem to come up pretty frequently and some block managers came across that problems when they were laying the linoleum.

Gerald Wumino will ask Associate Director Gelvin (Project Director Wade Head is in Washington) to make a statement, which should help clear this rumor up once and for all.

The project and problem of manpower will be channeled through the block manager system and presented to each block and if the people approve, they will probably work out their own system of drafting of manpower or asking for volunteers.

## 246# OF CUCUMBER HARVESTED

Agriculture department under the supervision of S. Gota has been successfully operating its three divisions, namely production, poultry and nursery with 120 men earnestly working to provide vegetables and chickens for the people.

Production division estimates the quantities of vegetables for the harvesting season as follows: 3 3/4 acre of squashes, 12,300 lbs. 1 acre of cucumbers 5,000 lb; 1 1/2 acre of nappas, 5,000 lbs, (picking started); 4 1/2 acre of tomatoes, 45,000 lbs (to be picked end of June); 4 acre of honeydews, 100,000 lbs; 4 acre of watermelons, 80,000 lbs and 1/2 acre of eggplants, 2,000 lbs (these three to be picked at end of July).

Poultry division reports that 1,000 chickens, which are 3 lb. each at present will be ready around June 15 to be served on Unit III mess tables. 2,000 layers are expected to lay eggs in October. Additional 3,000 chickens, 1,000 layers and 2,000 meat birds have arrived which made it necessary to build a 18 x 84 chicken house adjoining the others.

Nursery division which have been beautifying this unit with flower beds are now concentrating on vegetable plants and seeds.

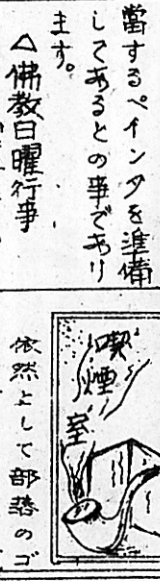
