EMPLOYMENT OFFICE LAUNCHES COUNSEL PROGRAM

To assist and stimulate evacuees in relocation, the Employment Division this week launched a counseling program, with member of the appointed staff assigned to the field unit office according to the following schedule:

Unit I--Tuesday, 9-11 a.m., Miss Dorothy Stevick; Wednesday, 9-11 a.m., Mrs. Mary Hayes; Thursday, 9-11 a.m., Miss Mary Ataloe; Saturday, 9-11 a.m., Miss Mary Ataloe.

Unit II--Wednesday, 9-11 a.m., John G. Hunter; Thursday, 9-11 a.m., Mrs. Mary Hayes.

Unit III--All week, Ralph R. Drennen Jr.

The counselors will work with the staffs of the field employment offices to interview individuals interested in relocation offers and will secure qualified residents to fill the offers.

Expansion of this schedule is contemplated as soon as conditions permit, the Employment Division announced.

Project Director Head returned late Wednesday afternoon from Washington, D.C. where he attended a series of conferences with WRA and War Dept. officials. Subsequent outcome of the meeting will be released to the public in the near future according to Mr. Head.

WAR DEPT. JOBS ARE OPEN

Major Peterson, Centralized Field Service, War Department, this week announced openings for experienced multi-lith operators.

The pay rate on these Civil Service jobs will be \$1620 per year plus \$300 for Saturday work, making possible a per annum earning of \$1920.

Qualified residents were requested to submit three copies of Civil Service form 57, which are available at the project office of the Employment Dept.

The Employment Division pointed out that this was the first instance of War Department job offers in fields other than language instructors or kitchen helpers. Details on this offer may be secured at the unit employment offices.

FIRST AID INSTRUCTORS NEEDED RED CROSS

In an renewed effort to increase the number of First Aid Instructors here in Poston, the Local Red Cross yesterday advised that "registration" for Advanced First Aid Course is still open. It will be taught every Monday and Thursday evenings, 7:30 to 9:30 at the Unit I Red Cross office, beginning June 14, with Dr. Richard Iwata as instructor.

In order to qualify for the Instructor's course, which is expected to be conducted very soon by the First Aid field instructor from San Francisco, students will have to receive his Advanced First Aid certificates, Dr. Iwata stated. "It is important that Poston get more First Aid Instructors to assist the community in times of any emergency."

The Advanced course requires 10 hours of training to complete for a certificate. Persons may apply at Rec. 30 Red Cross or attend the first class next Monday to register their name.

THREE NOMINATED TO EXAMING BOARD

Smith, and Edward Nosssoff to membership on a local examining board, which will act for the Civil Service Commission in holding written examinations and rating papers for evacuees desiring to qualify for Federal employment as Typists, Stenographers, and/or Clerks.

Miss D. Stevick and Ed Nosssoff are on the staff of the Employment Division, while Smith is the Personnel Officer of the Project. Their names have been submitted to the Regional Director in San Francisco.

When the nominations are approved by the San Francisco office, appropriate instructions, examination papers, and rating keys will be sent to the center, and preparations will be made to hold written tests and to rate the resulting papers.

DIES COMMITTEE HEARING

TOWNSEND IS BEHIND IT ALL

before the dies committee hearing on WRA relocation centers, in Los Angeles; poston's Associate project director, Ralph Gelvin and chief Administrative officer, A.W. Empie has appeared to answer a series of questions, prepared by the committee's investigators on the say so of one, Harold Townsend, one time transportation chief of this project. Mr. Townsend was given the boot by the WRA because, he seemed to have a habit of giving us flowery speeches and we had no respect for him and he could not get us to carry out his orders.

Townsend also stirred up the white personnel at the time of the strike by making them believe the strikers were going to swoop down and scalp them all.

In a word, a big trouble maker, who never knew what he was doing and probably still doesn't. A disgruntled former employee, who was fired for inefficiency---letting off steam in an effort to embarrass his former superiors and all persons of Japanese blood, in general, whether good or bad.

The incident at Heart Mountain relocation center, where some perfer fish wrapper charged them with hoarding hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of food, while the U.S. civilians went without that, was started by a bird named Pest, who was let out of this project as chief steward, caught on at Heart Mountain, but was let out there too, for inefficiency. Another disgruntled former employee taking it out on his former superiors.

It's a wonder such a committee can take seriously, statements made by the likes of Townsend and Pest.

Our answer to the likes of Townsend and Pest, should be not to curse them, but to thank them for a useful reminder. And having done that, we should make a careful estimate of where we stand, and what we could do to avoid such bozos and such incidents in the future.
