

## WORKERS WANTED BY RESORT HOTEL

The Edgewater Beach, a resort hotel at Detroit Lake, Minnesota, needs 25 workers for the season opening next week, the Employment Division announced.

The workers will be paid, in addition to board, room and laundry as follows: Chef, \$150 to \$200 per month; first cook to do fry work, \$75 to \$125; salad man or woman, \$75 to \$85; two dishwashers, \$15 to \$20 a week; pots and pan-washer, \$15 to \$20 a week; one or two kitchen helpers \$15 a week; six waitresses or waiters, \$30 per month plus tips; six chambermaids or housemen, \$10 a week plus tips; two bus and three bell boys, \$1 a day plus tips; one yardman, \$75 to \$85 per month; and assistant yardman, \$65. General tipping was assured.

The manager has employed Japanese American help before, and speaks Japanese. These positions will continue until September 1. Then the entire staff can be employed in a downtown Detroit Lake hotel, also owned by the manager.

### LETTERS PROHIBITED IN PACKAGES

Postmaster Erlon Gardner issued an emphatic reminder that enclosing written matter in packages is prohibited and that an infraction of this law is punishable by fine. He reported a recent offense wherein a parcel, on which \$8.41 postage was due, contained a letter.

Mr. Gardner also reported the receipt of a radio which had been mailed some time ago from Poston whose address had been torn off. "Assuring 14" x 17" x 17", the radio is wrapped in blue paper. The sender is asked to identify and claim it at the Post Office.

He added that airmail to the coast, south of San Francisco is an unnecessary waste of postage as it will reach its destination in the same amount of time as ordinary mail.

**WHAT DOES IT ALL**

(editorial) **ADD UP TO?**

This spring of 1943 is a sort of a turning point for 100,000 persons of Japanese blood in the 10 relocation centers. Thousands of these interned Japanese have been relocated into the vast middle west, hundreds of loyal U.S. citizens and law-abiding aliens are leaving the centers for outside employment every day and thousands of others are anxious to go, and aid this country's war effort.

Many shrewd observers think they can see the abolishment of the centers, and the resettlement of all loyal and law-abiding evacuees. In some ways, everything seems to be clicking. Then, the pie committee investigators swoop down on the JACL's Washington office and carry away all the records. They are searching for evidence; say the announcement, that an underground movement exists to plant Japanese from WRA centers in homes of high government officials. Obviously if a thing like that can happen, there's something wrong some where.

What does it all add up to? Do they want us to go or stay? Where do we stand?

We stand just about where we stood when we were herded into this man-made hell on earth. The truth is that, despite all the WRA can and is, doing for us, there are interests that are only interested in kicking the hell out of everyone of us, whether good or bad, loyal or disloyal.

The War Relocation Authority, we believe, was established to right a wrong. A wrong that has been recognized, perhaps too late, but recognized nevertheless. The WRA was established to take care of a group of people whose only crime was being of Japanese ancestry---a group of people of which over two-thirds are American born citizens....this government agency intends and is liquidating itself, by returning to normal life these people, so to speak, who are on their rolls and who have proven their loyalty either as citizens or law-abiding aliens.

And yet, criticism is directed by certain newspapers, groups and individuals. It seems inconsistent that on the one hand demands are made for abolishment of the centers and on the other hand discontinuance of releases.

Just what do they want, liquidation or continuance of the centers?
