

PROJECT DIRECTOR ADDRESSES POSTON I COUNCILMEN

Stating that it depends more upon the Poston Council than any other Councils of other centers to prove to the people of this country that a Council is the just thing to have as a governing body, Wade Head, Project Director, spoke for the first time before the permanent Unit I Local Council, June 29.

He added that Poston was one of the first centers to have a Council, and an Advisory Board, and to give elective offices to the Issei.

Cheap politicians were soundly criticized for spreading rumors, detrimental to the welfare of the community, and spreading unrest among the residents, Mr. Head told the Councilmen.

In conclusion, he stated that if the residents were to work together as one body, he would see to it that the outside is taken care of. (meaning those who are always criticizing the residents in the centers).

Mas Kawashima, former vice-chairman of the Executive Board, was elected by the Unit I Local Council to succeed M. Nagai of the Executive Board for the next three months.

A Committee, appointed at the last meeting to amend the rules and regulations of the Executive Board and the Labor Relation Board, recommended and amended the new regulations, which were

readily accepted by the councilmen.

During this time, Nakachi was re-elected chairman of the Labor Relations Board.

An ordinance, passed by the Unit I temporary council in regards to the regulations of the fire department, was repealed by the permanent Local Council on grounds that it conflicted with the new orders, issued by WRA. The Legal Department is to present the re-drafted forms to the Community Council.

AID GRANTS MAY BE GIVEN TO LEAVE ALTERS

Evacuees on seasonal leave who wish to go to some other locality on indefinite leave and who need financial assistance to get to the new place of employment should apply to the nearest relocation officer instead of returning to the Center, the Employment Division announced yesterday.

The ruling is based on a supplement to the Administrative Instruction which covers the payment of transportation and initial living expense grants.

Specifically prohibited by the instruction are grants "where an evacuee (on seasonal leave) has returned to a relocation center merely to secure such assistance and to leave for other employment on indefinite leave and the travel back to the project and to the

STEPS FOR POSITIONS IN DEFENSE PLANTS CLARIFIED

The Employment Division today clarified the steps necessary for an evacuee to secure positions in defense plants or in any Army or Naval establishments.

Before an evacuee can be employed in any vital war industries, he must first be cleared by the Japanese American Joint Board, composed of representatives of the War and Navy Departments and the WRA. This Joint Board renders its decision on the basis of the individual's answers to form 304A and other factors involving his past records. In addition, a field investigation of each person referred to them is taken under the jurisdiction of the Provost Marshall's Office.

It was also emphasized that until the Joint Board cleared the evacuee, relocation officers would not act to place an evacuee in any Army or Naval offices or any plants which is working on war contracts.



place of indefinite leave is substantially in excess of the travel distance from the place of seasonal leave to the initial destination on indefinite leave."

Ordinarily, evacuees on seasonal leave earn enough to enable them to get started in a permanent job without financial assistance from the government. For that reason, the instruction states, a grant will be issued to an applicant on seasonal leave only after a careful check of his cash resources.
