

DR. HARRIS ACTING ED. DIRECTOR

Dr. Arthur L. Harris, former principal of the Poston I High School, was officially notified that he had been appointed Acting Director of Education for the Poston Community by a bulletin signed by Project Director Wade W. Head and John D. Powell, Director of Community Service.

In a statement to the press he said:

"I have been appointed Acting Director of Education for Poston Community until I am cleared through the Civil Service for appointment to the directorship. I have been fully in sympathy with the educational policies in effect under the directorship of Dr. Miles E. Cary and intend that the same general policies shall continue in effect."

Miss Frances Cushman has been temporarily appointed Acting Principal of the Poston I Secondary School by Dr. Arthur L. Harris, Acting Director of Education, will succeed Chester E. Potts as the principal of the Poston III schools later.

Dr. Harris also stated that he has asked Mr. Hayano, an architect and chairman of the executive committee of the Poston I Parents Association to accept the appointment as Assistant Director of Education. "Mr. Hayano will act as a liaison officer in maintaining close communication between the schools and parents of the 3 Poston units. Because of his training and experience in architecture and construction, he will be of great service in the supervision of the program of remodeling of buildings for the elementary schools"

KUROIWA ELECTED TO OFFICE OF CITY MANAGER

K. Kuroiwa of Unit II and Jimmy Yahiro of Block 37, appointed by chairman Nakamura as city manager and city clerk, respectively, were readily accepted by the community Council in an open ballot, after a motion for a secret ballot was defeated. The acceptance of a treasury was held to the next meeting,

seeing that there was no need for it at the present time.

George Kurata of the hospital commission expressed Project Director Wade Head's request for the Council to recommend to the Director, the displaying of service stars for those who are in service from this center. This was unanimously accepted and a recommendation was sent to the Director to that effect. It was decided to hand the service stars by the corridor of the Project Director's office.

CASH GRANT STATUS CLARIFIED BY ZIMMERMAN

Clarifying the status of cash grants for indefinite leave, Giles L. Zimmerman, Chief Employment, declared today that applications for financial aid were still being accepted although no word has been received yet as to when funds would be available for paying off.

"We are still taking the vouchers in good faith," Zimmerman said, "assuming that payments will be made as soon as Congress passes the appropriation for the 1944 fiscal year, making money available to the WRA."

In answer to the belief in some quarters that financial aid was to be discontinued, Zimmerman pointed out that it would show the sighted of Washington, when the chief emphasis was on resettlement, to take away the means for stimulating relocation.

NO EVACUEES IN STATE AFTER WAR

Senator Earnest W. McFarland of Arizona, who visited Rivers and Poston recently, declared "it is most important that the Japanese who were residents of other states prior to Pearl Harbor shall not be permitted to locate in Arizona after the war."

Senator McFarland's statement--often stated by Arizona officials made no dent on the project consciousness. It was recalled here that the WRA had issued orders that evacuees would no longer be permitted to relocate in Arizona from the relocation centers. Issuance of day passes to Phoenix and other Arizona cities remained on the absolute minimum basis.

McFarland declared that he would also recommend that segregation of the loyal and the disloyal be carried out.

SUMMER ACTIVITY PLANNED IN UNIT 3

The activities of summer recreation for small children of pre-school age to adults started on Monday, July 5, under the supervision of Mrs. Lillian Onye.

Approximately 200 boys and girls have registered for activities on the school ground besides those who have signed up for classes under the block sheds.

All students and adults desiring to further their education or occupy their time by useful means are wholeheartedly welcome to attend and are requested to register at the teachers lounge at 24-9-A. No credits are given for any of the subjects completed.

Most of the classes will be conducted daily but a few will meet twice or three times weekly. Some of the activities that are being taught are: First Aid, arts and crafts, wood shop, fashion, drafting, shorthand, nature study, modern folk, and ballroom dancing, model airplane, mathematics, and radio club.
