

YMCA MEMBER TO ARRIVE IN POSTON

Masao Sato, member of the National Council of the YMCA, is expected to come to Poston on July 8 from Gila Relocation Center. He has been making a tour of the relocation centers to organize and help bolster YMCA activities and also to talk on relocation.

He was formerly, the executive secretary of the Japanese YMCA in Los Angeles and was evacuated to the Granada center, where he was temporary and permanent chairman of the Community Council until employed by the National YMCA staff. A program is being planned by the Community Activities department for the 10 days that he expects to be here.

A group interested in having him give a lecture or advise, they are asked to come to the Community Activities office for arrangements.

CHICAGO ACCEPTS EVACUEE PUPILS

Allaying rumors prevalent in some centers, Elmer L. Shirrell, relocation supervisor in Chicago, reported this week that children living in Chicago whose parents also live in the city are admitted free of charge to all city schools. There are no requirements on length of residence.

"Residents of the centers should be assured that evacuees are accepted in the Chicago public schools on exactly the same basis as any other children," Shirrell said. "They received neither more nor less consideration"

Families moving into the city today may enter their children in Chicago schools the same day, without pay-

HAWAIIAN NOISES ELIGIBLE FOR RETURN

CANAL BUILDING TO EMPLOY WORKER

Manpower shortage became a main factor in the construction of irrigation canal to the Center agriculture project with the recent release of 75% of the Caucasian workers. It is contemplated by the department in the near future that more workers will be released from the canal construction which means more evacuee workers will be required in order to complete the main canal from the Headgate in Parker.

At the present time 15 miles of the canal has been constructed which leaves a balance of two miles yet to be constructed. The excavation of the canal by drag line will continue as on regular schedule with the workers retained to complete the project.

R. H. Rupkey, Chief Construction Engineer, stated "in order to complete the canal for the agriculture project more evacuee workers will be needed in the immediate future." The canal can now be considered as the life line of the Center with the reduction of subsistence allowance to 31 cents with the balance to be grown here in the Center.

After an inquiry to the War Dept. about the eligibility of Americans of Japanese ancestry to return to Hawaii under the same conditions as are applied for all other Hawaiian residents, J. R. Farrington, a Delegate from Hawaii disclosed the following:

"The department informs me that the return of those citizens is governed by a policy established by an agreement between the Commanding General of the Hawaiian Department and the Commanding General of the 14th Naval District.

The dominating factors in granting permission for the return are that the individual is not, for a number of reasons, excluded from returning to the Islands, and the availability of transportation. Bona fide residents do not come within the category of those excluded. However, each case will be carefully examined.

You should make application to the Commanding General of the Hawaiian Department, stating that you are a bona fide resident of Hawaii, naming the particular locality where your home is, and the reason you are now on the mainland, and requesting return on some approximately specific date.

As you know, the transportation situation is acute, and insofar as there are many to obtain accommodations even after permission to return has been granted."
