

## MISS FINDLEY IN HAWAII DENIES STATEMENTS

In a recent interview with the Honolulu Star Bulletin, Miss Nell Findley, former director of Social Welfare Department in Poston, Arizona denied the charges made by H.H. Townsend, a former camp supply officer, before the Dies Sub-committee.

"They--the residents, never sang the Japanese National Anthem; they never pulled down the American flag. They never held Caucasian camp employees under siege and threat of death for a week," she replied when shown news stories relating to the disturbances of the center last November.

She denied the charge by Mr. Townsend made before the Dies sub-committee that the Japanese evacuees tore down the fence around the camp. The fence was to originally to have been "a guard fence but the project director and some of his first assistants, like myself," requested that a boundary fence be installed to keep out cattle from the camp, Miss Findley related. "They (the evacuees) never touched it. We didn't need a fence for them," she added.

The strike of the camp residents was called for reasons "so complicated and involved" that Miss Findley said she still doesn't know the "whole reason".

"The touchoff of the strike was the arrest of two men who had beaten up a pro-American Japanese in the center. Then all the accumulation of grievances came to the forefront.

"The project director wanted to settle the matter between the administration and the

### MAGAZINES SENT TO SANATARIUM

The first shipment of magazines, and games contributed by the residents for the patients at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Phoenix, through the Red Cross--was sent in person by Miss Elma Rood, Public Health consultant here, the Red Cross announced.

"The result--far beyond expectation--no doubt will deepen the patients' heart with appreciation for their missed friends in Poston," Miss Rood said. "The aftermath of the strike was that some pro-Japanese were removed from the center, new council elections, and changes were brought about for better administrative action, she said.

Answering charges that Japanese evacuees took government lumber on the premises, Miss Findley said; "if they took lumber they took it with the understanding the government provided them with materials to make furniture. They had no way of buying lumber. They were not furnished with tables and chairs. And we were making lumber scavengers out of them!"

Miss Findley said she believes "some marvelous things" will come out of the greatest migration in this country's history, which involved the relocation of 100,000 Japanese to the inland.

A letter from H. V. Church, Secretary of the National Honor Society, informed Dr. Arthur L. Harris, Director of Education, that the Poston Chapter of the National Honor Society has been accepted and its constitution approved. The charter number issued is 2724. Each member elected to the chapter is to be presented with an engraved membership card. This society is a part of the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

Negotiations for the crediting of the Poston schools for eligibility for the California Scholarship Federation Membership have fallen through, according to Tom Sakai, Assistant Principal of the Poston I Secondary School.

### UNIT I JUDICIAL COMMISSION TO RESIGN

It was disclosed at the Unit I local Council meeting last Wednesday that Elmer Yamamoto, chairman of the Unit I Judicial Commission, S. Nomura and Sugi who were elected to the commission expects to resign in the near future.

# SNELSON RELEASES MAXIMUM NUMBER OF MESS WORKERS
