Washington, June 23 (Special).--Milton S. Eisenhower, Director of the War Relocation Authority, has been appointed deputy director of the War Information Service. Mr. Eisenhower will be succeeded as WRA Director by Dillon Myer. Acting Administrator of the Agricultural Conservation and Adjustment Administration, US Dept. of Agriculture. Mr. Myer was formerly assistant chief of the Soil Conservation Service.

Approximately 200 Poston residents attended Saturday night meeting devoted to the Community Store fiscal system held in Mess Hall 28. Most discussion centered on questions relating to the "mark up" of goods sold at the canteen, and to profits derived from the sales of goods. Store Manager Fred Ota said: "The canteen's average markup is from 20 to 25 per cent over original cost plus freight charges, whereas in most

outside areas similar articles are sold with markups of from 35 to 40 percent.
