

BE IT SO RESOLVED that effective immediately the organization of the said Industry and Manufacturing be limited to merely manufacturing and processing of the goods only; that it refrain entirely from any kind of purchasing and selling of goods processed, raw, semi-processed or whatever the stage of processing the goods may be classified; that is refrain enw tirely from purchasing and selling of material merchandise and, or articles of goods in any manner; that the Community Enterprises be the sole organization within the center to furnish raw materials for manufacturing and processing by the Industry and Manufacturing, and that the said Community Enterprises be the sole or-contration authorized to sell and dispose of the merchandises thus manufactured and prosessed by the Industry and Manufacturing, and produrement of merchandise, equipment, tools, aupplies and other such goods heretofore furnished through the WRA progurement be continued in same manner and the Tofu and Moyashi Manufacturing of Poston III continue to be operated on the manner as previously done.
