

FOREIGN PROPERTY OWNERS MUST REGISTER

All persons who had any property in a foreign country on May 31, 1943 must file a report before November 1, 1943, according to Theodore H. Haas, Project Attorney.

Every person subject to the jurisdiction of the United States who had any interest, direct or indirect, in any property in a foreign country including bonds issued in a foreign country must file a report. Persons allied with a foreign organization must also make a report.

The Law Department has copies of the required forms, TFR-500 and a detailed report on the preparation of these forms.

JAPANESE AMERICAN GIRL'S ACCEPTABLE FOR WACS

Further details are awaited today on a recent War Department announcement that a limited number of American-born women of Japa-

nese descent will be accepted for enlistment in the Women-SS Army Corps.

Reports to date indicate that the enlistment of nisei women will coincide with the date of general enlistment in the WAC, attendant upon conversion of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps on Sept. 1 into a corps of the Army of the United States.

The success which attended the Army's recruitment of American men of Japanese descent led to the adoption of the plan, thus giving loyal nisei women an opportunity to serve their country along with other women, the War Department announcement stated.

Arrangements are being made to accept applications at War Relocation Centers. Girls accepted for enlistment will not be placed in a special unit, it was pointed out.

Lt. Col. Carl T. Gould, Director of the Personnel at Camp Savage, will interview prospective candidates for the Military Intelligence Language School, in Unit II, James D. Crawford's office today.

Lt. Col. Gould indicated that he was accepting a limited amount of students whose language qualifications were below the usual standard.

He will continue interviewing tomorrow in Ass. Praj. Dir. Ralph Gelvin's office in U-

nit I. Interested applicants may contact him there at any time during Wednesday.

Poston is next to the last stop in his itinerary relocation centers, the Col. said. He has already visited Rowher, Jerome, Gila and will proceed to Manzanar from here. Col. Kai Rasmussen, is touring the northern relocation centers.

Lt. Col. Gould, was Assistant Military Attaché in Tokyo at the outbreak of the war. He had been in Japan for 2 years, prior to Pearl Harbor. On declaration of War he was interned, and returned to the U.S. on the first exchange ship.

RATIONED GOODS MAY BE SHIPPED INTO CENTER

Rationed foodstuffs held in private or Government storages by evacuees purchased by him as a consumer may have them shipped to him as in the case of any other of his property, according to Theodore H. Haas, Project Attorney.

However, if he owns rationed foodstuff as a former retailer, wholesaler or other dealer in such products, there can be no transfer with OPA. Even if the evacuee wishes to have rationed goods sent to him for his own use and consumption, this requires clearance by OPA as if a sale to a third person were being consummated.
