POSSIBLE ELECTRIC CURTAMENT SEEN

"The load on the electric system is exceeding the capacity of the system in many blocks. Due to this overload, the transformer and the wiring in many blocks are in extreme danger of burning out. There are no spare transformers of the proper size and the loss of a transformer would be serious to the block involved," stated R. H. Rupkey, Chief Engineer, in a memo to the block managers.

In order to minimize the danger of overloading the wires the following instructions were outlined by Rup-

key:

1. Do not use electric hot plates, toasters, and coffee pots between the hours of 4 to 10 p.m., except in cases of illness. 2. Avoid as much as

2. Avoid as much as possible the use of electric irons during

these hours.

3. Avoid unnecessery use of lights.

Because of the dangers involved, it will be necessary to collect unnecessary electrical appliances and put them in storage unless the present overloaded condition of the electric system is discontinued.
