

ESCORT TO ARRIVE FOR SEASONAL WORKERS

Information reaching the Seasonal Work Dept. this week stated that an escort is arriving in the Center August 9 to take out 104 workers for peak harvesting in Grand Junction, Colo.

Seasonal leave office reported that all the available positions have not been filled yet, and that recruiting will continue until the time for departure on August 10.

The job will last from August 16 to Oct. 15, it was announced. Interested residents were advised to apply at their respective unit employment offices as quickly as possible.

APPROXIMATELY 1100 SEGREGANTS TO LEAVE OCTOBER 1ST

Stressing that no stigma of any kind will be attached to persons leaving for Tule Lake Center and that Poston will not be closed, as rumored, as a relocation center, Project Director Wade Head made his initial appearance, since his return from the Denver Conference, before the Poston Community Council, in a meeting held in the Conference Room, Aug. 5, attended by Ralph Gelvin, Associate

Director Theodore Haas, Project Attorney, and Moris Burge, Unit III Administrator.

Director Head stated that about 1100 persons will begin their movement around October 1, and stated that it is no disgrace for them to go to Tule Lake.

Moris Burge, former Acting Project Director in the absence of Director Head, was announced to be in charge of the segregation program with his office located next to the Director's office.

Tule Lake will be similar to Poston, except that there will be no Community Council or Judicial Commission, it was explained by Mr. Head.

DEPARTEE MUST NOTIFY DRAFT BOARD NEW ADDRESS

VANDALS BREAK INTO LA. CHURCH

Due to the theft of goods, T. Momita, Ass't Evacuee Property Officer, advises all evacuees that have household and personal effects stored at the Nichiren Buddhist Temple at 2800 East Third Street in Los Angeles to execute WRA Form 155 or 156 so that their property may be safe-guarded by the WRA Transportation Div.

The WRA Form 155 is a request for storage of goods which will be stored in the government warehouses until they are called for. Form 156 is a request for transportation of property to this center as soon as a carload is obtained.

The Los Angeles police reported that some property is missing from the church and an investigation is being made.

Male evacuees registered with Selective Service who are leaving on seasonal or indefinite leave were reminded yesterday to notify their local board of their new address.

Pursuant to Selective Service regulations, they must keep the local board with which they are registered advised of their whereabouts at all times and carry their classification card (DSS Form 57) on their person.

Reports state that the police and FBI are picking up persons who have classification cards which are so old as to indicate that the bearers have not kept their local boards informed as to their address.

If a male evacuee has only his initial Selective Service registration certificate (DSS Form 2), he should write his local board for a classification card, it was pointed out.

POSTON ICE SUPPLY CUT

A shortage of ice is being felt throughout Poston due to the fact that the Parker Ice Co. is not able to procure all the ice the center desires, stated F. M. Haverland, Supply and Transportation officer. Attempts are being made to secure additional sources of supply, but until that time, it will be necessary to curtail the use of ice on this project.

It was anticipated that the kitchens will be given as nearly as possible the ice required. Curtailment will take place largely in other divisions and activities now using ice, Mr. Haverland disclosed.

MARYKNOLL SISTERS
CONDUCTING CLASSES

In an effort to assist the students of Poston during the summer session, two Maryknoll Sisters from Los Angeles recently arrived, according to Father Clement. The Sisters are to conduct a one week class at Chapel 45 during the morning period. More than 100 students enrolled to date, it was also disclosed that the public is cordially invited to attend.

Father Clement stated that the Sisters have had more than 20 years of experience with the Japanese people. Furthermore, a bit of good news was released with the announcement that the Sisters are formerly of the San Juan Bautista, Maryknoll and would like to have the residents visit them during the evenings at the Chapel.

2748 EVACUEES ON
LEAVE FROM POSTON

According to the latest statistics released by the Population Bureau, a total of 2748 evacuees are out of the Center on seasonal work and indefinite leave.

At the end of July, 1616 had departed on indefinite leave, while 1132 were out on seasonal work. During the last week in July, the town which attracted most Poston residents for employment was Ann Arbor, Michigan, claiming 12 of the total of 73 who left in the period.

Following is the statement of Poston 3 Trust Fund released by Unit 3, Community Council:

Balance on Hand, June 30, 1943--\$8892; Shibal, June and July allocations of \$50 each mo., \$100; Japanese name contest award--\$10; English name contest award--\$10; PC3AA (for purchase of sporting equipment--\$200; Mimeograph machine--\$129.50; stapling machine, staples, hole, punch, postage--\$11.08; Mimeograph inks, stencils, stylus--\$37.68; Poston CC for Marcantonio Bill H.R. 2011 petitions forms--\$2.50; Poston Gen. Hospital Commission Unit 3 portion of Hospital distribution and emergency fund. Ratio of 2-1-1. Unit I--\$5000; Unit 2--\$2500; Unit 3--\$2500.

Total disbursement--\$11892.76. Balance of Trust Fund--\$1668.27.

Note: \$70 loan made to Post Office to be reimbursed into the Trust Fund.

\$500 set aside for purchase of fixtures and materials for Poston Square Garden in event not obtainable through WRA.

\$1000 to be invested in athletic equipment, such fund to be reverted back to Trust Fund.

Starting with Block 207 this morning, segregation hearings will be conducted in Unit II. Administrator James D. Crawford and Ernest L. Miller, Chief of Internal Security have been appointed by Project Director W. Wade

Funeral Held For S. Isomoto

Funeral services were conducted for the late Mrs. Sakuyo Isomoto of block 227 who passed away Tuesday at the General Hospital after a prolonged illness.

The Rev. Iwanaga and Rev. Nakatani officiated at sacred Buddhist rites Friday morning.

The deceased, formerly of Hawthorne, California is survived by one son Isamu, and her husband who is presently confined in the local hospital.

Local Clinic Statistics Reported

Working relentlessly for the welfare of the community, the Poston Two clinic staff is to be lauded for their commendable service.

Despite the handicap of insufficient materials and a limited staff, all patients of both minor and extreme cases have been treated accordingly.

Headed by Dr. Henry Kazato and B. Okonogi, the medical department has cared for over 15,685 patients between July 7, 1942 and July 31, 1943.

Registered nurses are Mrs. Ruby Miura and Mrs. T. Mizuno. The dental department staffed by Dr. F. Ito and Dr. M. Miura has treated 7,695 patients between July 9, 1942 and July 31, 1943.

Dr. Masao Takoshita of the Optometry division has received 3,465 patients between July 10, 1942 to July 31, 1943.

Head to the Board of Review for Segregation and will interview all persons who have answered negatively to the Loyalty question number 28.

Manabu Fukuda and K. Kazato have been appointed by Mr. Head to act as observers at the hearings.

With approximately 258 persons to be interviewed with 10 minutes given each interview, the hearings will last about one week.

Those persons who gave qualified answers to question 28 will not be given interview at this time.

Notices will be sent to persons who are to appear before the board, giving the time and place, in their respective blocks.

By August 20th, when all hearings will have been completed, persons who are on the segregation list will get notices to the effect that they will be going to Tulalake.

At the same time, those who are cleared by the Board of Review will receive notices to that effect.

The segregation movement of Poston to Tulalake will start early in October.
