

## SIXTEEN PASS WATER SAFETY COURSE

Twenty-two lifeguards from the three camps took the Water Safety course during July 26-August 7, with Sidney L. Llambias, field representative, as their instructor, the Red Cross declared today.

Sixteen members were awarded the Water Safety Instructors' certificate, while all of them passed the senior lifeguard examination.

## POSTON SUPPLIED LOCAL PORK

Due to a shortage of pork which was developed in many sections of the country, Poston will have to depend on its own pork supply during the months of August and September, according to chief steward C. E. Snelson.

The slaughter house is now equipped with an ammonia cooling plant so as to insure proper chilling of meat before being sent to subsistence reefers. The Subsistence was also fortunate in securing a reefer truck for transporting meat from the reefers to the kitchens.

Chief cooks should consult the menu when meat is delivered to their mess hall, as they may find themselves without meat for a longer period than usual.

Poston mess halls are now receiving fresh vegetables from Tule Lake, some of which are: string beans, lettuce, peas, spinach and nappa. If planting in Tule Lake is successful, daikon may soon be delivered here, Snelson stated. A shortage of eggs is expected during the coming months due to natural causes.

## FIRST GROUP OF SEGREGANTS COMPOSED OF 281 FAMILIES

The first group of people who will be slated to go from Poston to Tule Lake under the plan of segregation includes the people who have made repatriation or expatriation applications which had not been withdrawn prior to the first of July.

The list of residents from all three units of Poston shows a total of 281 families or 590 persons, it was announced from the office of W. Wade Head, projector director today.

All of these people, with the exception of 20 whose names appear on the list scheduled for the next sailing of an exchange ship to Japan, will be moved

to Tule Lake, it was stated. At the same time it was announced that no applications for repatriation or expatriation are being received at this time and no requests for withdrawal of such applications previously made will be received at this time.

The family size group of those included in the list of repatriates and expatriates was given as follows: Individual persons (single) 172; two persons 30; three persons 25; four persons 19; five persons 2; six persons 2; seven persons 8; eight persons 2; nine persons 2; and ten persons 1.

## JOB OFFERS FOR POSTON DECREASE

Job offers received in the Center dropped from 454 in June to 395 in July, suggesting a trend which will continue at an accelerated rate for the next two months, Tats Kushida, head of outside employment, reported yesterday.

With Tule Lake Center and some other projects getting first shot at outside jobs during the segregation process, Kushida predicted that Poston, being near the bottom of the priority list, will face further curtailment in the number of incoming offers.

## BACHELOR STABBED AT BLOCK FOUR

A bachelor, residing at the bachelors' quarter in Block 4 was severely slashed on the right buttock by another member of the quarter early Sunday morning according to E. R. Miller, Chief Internal Security Officer.

The attack took place at 5:30 a.m. Sunday morning while the victim was asleep, who was cut about the buttock where an artery was severed. The victim is confined to the Poston General Hospital and it was stated that he is not in serious danger.

The cause of the stabbing was not determined but a thorough investigation is being made by the local authorities.
