

SEGREGATION NOT FORCED RELOCATION

The WRA officials had been studying the problem of segregation for nearly a year. E. M. Rowatt, deputy director, told residents of the Tule Lake center in a talk there. The reason for segregation, he said, was not because of any public clamor but because it is felt the best interests of all of the people can be served in this way. The object is to separate in two groups in relocation centers, first, those who look to the United States as their future home, and second, those who look to Japan as their future home.

The deputy director made it plain that segregation is in no way a plan of forced relocation.

"Everyone in the relocation centers should understand thoroughly the purpose of segregation and the benefits this program will give to Japanese Americans who remain in this country after the war is over", Mr. Rowatt declared. "There will be ample time to have all your questions answered. It is very important that you understand thoroughly what we are trying to do is for the benefit of all Japanese persons now residents of the United States."

SANTA FE R. R. SEEKS WORKERS

Twenty five to thirty men between the ages of 18 and 55 are wanted for seasonal work by the Santa Fe Railway from August to December. The Employment Division announced yesterday.

The evacuees will work in section gangs and receive 50¢ per hour for an eight-hour day plus time and a half for overtime.

POSTON SCHOOLS TO CONTINUE SAYS DR. HARRIS

"Poston schools will continue throughout the coming year," asserted Dr. Arthur L. Harris, Poston's Director of Education, persisting in his effort to prevent rumors to the effect that after the segregation is completed Poston will immediately be disbanded. It will not be possible to close the school units for the next few years, Dr. Harris disclosed.

The appointed staff personnel, recruited approximately 40% over last year's staff membership, have been assured that they will have positions in Poston in the coming year.

REPATRIATES REGISTERING WITH CONSUL CALLED

There are some few people in Poston who may have made application for repatriation to the Spanish consul before coming to this center and therefore, their names may not appear on the project list of repatriates, it was stated yesterday. Mr. Head has issued a notice to the people asking that anyone who made application in this way and has any letter or other evidence that such an application was filed, should bring the letter to the Welfare Dept.

It was expected that more of these people may be residents of Unit III than any other of the units because the people in Unit III came to Poston at a later date.

The enrollment of the teachers for the various grade levels of the Poston schools were said to be 206 teachers.

The schools will open for the coming session as soon as the school buildings situation in the 3 Postons permits. It is hoped that this may be effected by September 13. On the basis of enrollment and registration figures it is necessary to use the complete Adobe school units in this project in addition to the barrack and recreation hall spaces which were put into use last session.

Approximately 3,000 students will enroll in the three unit schools, including high school, elementary, kindergarten and nursery this fall, the Education Dept. disclosed.

LEAFLETS ON TULE LAKE AVAILABLE

A two page description of the Tule Lake center prepared by the Reports Officer there, John D. Cook, has been mimeographed and will be available to persons who want copies. The statement tells about the living accommodations, methods of handling ration matters, and other material which people who are going to Tule Lake center may want to know.

Copies will be available at the Welfare office in all three units or through the office of the unit administrator.

COOLER MOTORS REPORTED MISSING

Two cooler motors were reported missing from the Poston I school grounds recently where they have been installed for the Teachers' Summer Session, according to Dr. Arthur L. Harris, director of Education.

Dr. Harris, who is confronted with the same problems that his predecessor, Dr. Miles E. Cary had to deal with, stated "The individual who took the motors off the coolers at the school building would also steal a milk bottle from baby carriages."

REGISTRATION OPEN FOR SWIMFEST

With preparations for the coming Swimfest, sponsored by the Red Cross Lifeguards, which is to be held Aug. 29, at the 21 Natatorium, registration for participants is now open until 9 p.m. on the 25th of August at either of the three Red Cross Pools or at the Blk. 30 Office.

All Boys' and Girls' Clubs and Organizations are especially urged to register as teams in order to obtain the championship pennant for the year. Individual entrants will also be accepted.

RULES

All young persons of unit one, up to and including 18 years of age are eligible to enter the Class Events. In the Open Events (all ages unlimited) swimmers will participate in various competitions also. Entrants will be allowed to compete in two class races, a relay, and in all "open" events, though in the latter, the judges reserve the right to reject some contestants, if necessary.

CLASSIFICATIONS

It will be grouped as follows: Class C - under 12 years; class B - 13 to 15; and class A - 16 to 18 years old. Open events.

POINTS

Five points will be awarded to first place winners; 3 points to the 2nd place; and single point goes to third position. Eight points will be credited for the relay event (first place only).

U. OF WISCONSIN RELEASES WAGE CONDITIONS IN STATE

A farm family of four in the Milwaukee, Wisconsin, area earning wages of \$75 a month is as well off financially as a city-dweller with a salary of from \$1860 to \$1892 a year, according to a study recently released by the Home Economics Department of the University of Wisconsin.

The average farm in the Milwaukee area, the University reports, furnishes shelter worth about \$55 a month and the yearly supply of fuel for heating, and about 75 per cent. of the food used by the farmer and his family. Fuel supplied by the farm would cost about \$40 if paid for out of cash income, and food raised and consumed at home adds another \$500 to \$532 to the average farm family's actual income.

To a family of three a farm job near Milwaukee at \$75 a month is worth from \$835 to \$860 a year more than an urban job at equivalent wages; to a family of four from \$960 to \$992 more; to a family of five from \$1085 to \$1125 more; and to a family of six from \$1280 to \$1328 more, the report says.
