

## 3000 ON LEAVE FROM CENTER

Though momentarily overshadowed by segregation, the relocation program in the Center is proceeding as usual with only a slight decrease in the number of residents going out, the Employment Division reported today.

Departure Thursday night of 113 seasonal workers for Grand Junction, Colorado, brought the total number of persons outside the Center on all types of leave to over 3000.

## CONSTRUCTION ON H.S. BUILDING TO START SOON

Dr. Willard W. Beatty, Director of Indian Education, announced Wednesday at the teachers' reception that construction work on the high school adobe building to be located near Blk. 26 will start almost immediately. He gave the reason that with the present situation in the classrooms, at least half of the elementary and secondary schools would still be scattered in the blocks.

## FUJINKAI SERVES TEA TO TEACHERS AT SESSION

The Fujinkai in Poston I have been cooperating commendably in serving tea to the teachers attending the summer sessions every day at the adobe school buildings.

It is reported that nearly 200 teachers are being served tea daily by the Fujinkai with each block taking turns daily. The tea takes place between 3 and 5 o'clock every afternoon at the school grounds.

## ADVISORY COMMITTEE NAMED

Members of the advisory committee on segregation representing all three units of Poston have been named by Project Director Head, on recommendations made to him by the Community Council. He had previously requested the names to be submitted to him in a letter

directed to the Council. Those appointed are: Unit I --- Messrs. T. Matsumoto, Onishi, J. Yehiro, Y. Mohri, Nishijima, and Mrs. Kawahara. Unit II Messrs. M. Fukuda, Nagano, Uyeno, D. Imahara and Capt. Kita-ji. Unit III Messrs. F. Kagiwada, M. Ozawa, M. Matsumoto, Revs. Imai and Sakow.

Morris Burge who is in charge of the segregation program met with members of the committee for the first time this morning at 10 o'clock in the conference room in the administration building in Unit I.

Mr. Head has stated that he wanted this committee to be representative of the residents of all three units and to work closely with the administrative staff in an advisory and consultant way, in the development and carrying out of the segregation program within the framework of the rules prescribed by the national director. It is expected that the committee will hold regular meetings with Mr. Burge and other members of the administrative staff.

In order to house both groups satisfactorily as soon as possible, it will be necessary to rush the construction of the building.

The foundations for the first five units of the school will probably be poured next week. Dr. A. Harris, Director of Education, stated.

He speculated that the construction would possibly take less than 9 months due to that the larger part of the heavy building on the elementary school was completed within 9 months and the high school, although larger, should not take as long because of the experience already gained by the people who work on it.

## NO TULE LAKE FOR CRYSTAL CITY APPLICANTS

Wives and other members of families of persons interned, who had made application to move to the Crystal City internment center, prior to July first, will not be moved from Poston to Tule Lake, it was announced yesterday at the office of the Project Director. These

people will remain at Poston at least for the present.

A number of inquiries have been made to the family welfare office on this question in the last few days. It is expected that each case will be given special consideration at a later date.

**UNIT I TOFU FACTORY TO RESUME OPERATIONS**

Tofu manufacturing Unit I will resume operations this Monday, according to an announcement from the Department of Industries.

The motor which broke down two weeks ago has been repaired and installed, and the cooking units have been reinforced with iron straps and concrete.

Repairs on the motor were made in the Boston machine shop by evacuee machanists who cooperated to meet the emergency and made it unnecessary to ship the motor to Phoenix for the repairs.

**REV. DAVIDSON BIK. 5 SBEAKER**

Rev. Hubert Davidson, pastor of the Tenth Avenue Baptist Church of Los Angeles has been secured by the Poston Christian church of Unit I as a speaker for this Sunday's outdoor service to be held at Block 5 Park which will commence at 9 pm.

Many of the young people will remember the guest speaker as the Forest Home Retreat speaker a few years ago. He has been interested in the religious affairs of the nisei and comes to Poston with a deep understanding.

**SHADED BUS STATION ERECTED AT POOL**

For the benefit of the appointed personnel and evacuees who use the inter-camp bus service, a new shaded bus station has been erected at the Motor Pool, according to William A. Barrett, dispatcher.

The station was built by the landscaping crew under the supervision of Frank Kadowa ki.

**154 NURSERY CHILDREN TO BE EXAMINED**

A total of 154 children entering nursery school for the first time will be examined by the doctor, according to Miss Elma Rood, Supervisor of Public Health Nursing.

Miss Rood stated that it is very important that every child have the examination in order that the school may know just how to give each child individual care according to his needs.

Conferences will be arranged after all the examinations are completed, to interpret to the parents the health condition of each child and to advise on what may be done to help each child, improve, stated Miss Rood.

Notices will be sent to the parents as to the day and hour to bring their children to Ward 7.
