

TREATMENT OF PAROLEES SAME AS EVACUEES

Parolees under the WRA rules for segregation are not treated as a separate class, it was stated officially yesterday from the administration office. There has been reports that all parolees would go to Tule Lake.

"This is not the case," declared Moris Burge who has charge of the segregation program here. "Parolees will be treated exactly the same for segregation as any other resident. If they had made application for repatriation prior to July first, and this application had not been withdrawn, they would fall in group One and would be segregated. If they come in any of the other categories for interview by the Board for Segregation Review, they would be treated just the same as any other resident. If they are in group three or recommended for hearing for leave clearance, this hearing will be given under Administrative Instruction 22."

PAULINE BROWN NEW REPORTS OFFICER HERE

STORM DAMAGES UNIT 001 SCHOOL STRUCTURES

A torrential down-pour combined with a strong north wind raised havoc in Camp 3 last Monday afternoon about 2:30, doing considerable damage to the new school structures that were being completed for the fall term inundating roads and block gardens and damaging the small trees planted last spring.

Roofs of three school buildings at the Camp 3 school unit were blown off by the strong north wind scattering the roofing materials about the school grounds.

SEVEN ARMY VOLUNTEERS TO LEAVE

The 5th contingent of seven volunteers for the All-Nisei-Combat-Unit at Camp Shelby, Miss. is scheduled to leave Poston, next Wednesday night, August 25, for Fort Douglas, Utah, according to Giles Zimmerman, Leave Office Head.

The departure of this group will bring the total number of Combat-Unit Volunteers from Poston, since the initial departure of the first contingent, last May 10, to 98.

The named volunteers are: Osam Ogawa, Blk. 213, Giro Oka, Blk. 222; Saburo Oka, Blk. 222; Howard Kazuo Ichinaga, Blk. 227, Katsuma Nishimoto, Blk. 222, Kobe Shoji, Blk. 4, and Takeo Matsuda, Blk. 5.

Further additional names may be forthcoming, it was stated.

The adobe wall of the south building was destroyed when the roof from the adjacent building flew off.

Small damages were done to the other structures which are repairable. Chas. Popkins, Construction Engineer, stated that the adobe building could be repaired without any trouble as only a small amount of mud is needed to restore to the buildings to their original condition.

Small damages were done to the Unit 2 school buildings.

In the warehouse district, five ridge vents were blown off from warehouses 316 to 320. It was disclosed that 285 sacks of rice were slightly damaged. No damage was done to the barracks.

The Ag. Dept. reported that approximately 500 2-months old chicks have died due to the storm and the mortality is still rising.

No crop damages were reported.

The hard work on the Unit 3 amphitheatre ground work was wasted when the adobe bricks melted.

Small cottonwood and elm trees in the north western sections were flattened to the ground by the force of the strong north wind.

Roads were washed out and flooded in some areas of the camp, making travel difficult for the residents.

No damage was done in Units 1 or 2, where the rainfall was less, it was reported.

Igrry Hamada and his Shelby Hawaiians entertained the party during in termission with the music and dances of the Islands. Pvt. Paul Mannai served as master of ceremonies. The guests received gardenia "black-out" corsages as favors. The souvenir program featured Artillery terms applicable to the occasion.

West in the open air chapel "under the pines": In groups of twenty, the girls were luncheon guests at mess halls in the battalion area. After each of the Wednesday meetings, it is planned that the members of the committee will arrange for dissemination of information on the developments of the segregation program to the different evacuee groups within all three units. There are representatives of all units serving on the committee.

55 WORKERS NEEDED FOR CONSTRUCTION

An emergency crew of 55 workers are immediately wanted by the Construction Dept. of Unit 2 to build 3 additional elementary school rooms, an auditorium and a new campus library.

Project work will take three to four months with regular wages.

CHRONICLE TO BE DELIVERED GRATIS SOON

Due to the need for the publication of more official information at the time of the segregation, plans are being made for the WRA to furnish a subsidy in the form of materials and supplies to the Poston Chronicle, which will permit printing and delivering a copy of the paper to every family in the three units of the Poston center, it was announced today. This means that for a time at least every family will get the Chronicle whether a subscription has been paid or not.

Details of the plan have not been worked out entirely, it was stated, but the quality of the paper on which the Chronicle is printed will be improved and when possible more pages will be given in order to present more official information and at the same time give the local community news. The number of pages and amount of news will, of course, be limited by the mechanical equipment available for the printing of the Chronicle it was stated.

Instead of having a Japanese section every day, the present plan contemplates more news in the Japanese language two days a week and more news in the English language three days a week.

The Chronicle will continue to publish, Kenneth K. Hirose, business manager stated. We hope, he added that it will be vastly improved and will be able to render better service to the people of all three units of Poston.
