

POSTON TEACHERS LEARN METHODS OF TEACHING

With the summer school half over, the courses are in full swing and everything is satisfactory, according to Homer Howard, Dir. of Summer Session. Courses are being offered to three groups of teachers--nursery and kindergarten; apprentice, and experienced, who will teach in Poston this term.

The nursery and kindergarten teachers attend classes where they watch methods of teaching and learn why they are used.

Apprentice teachers are those who have never taught before. They teach classes under the supervision of competent teachers who show them their good and bad points.

Experienced teachers observe demonstration classes, study child psychology and mental hygiene. They also formulate curricular with special attention to the grades for which the courses are intended.

In addition to these required subjects, teachers may enroll for one of the following electives: adult education for relocation; creative writing; education in wartime and for peacetime; and vocational and academic education.

SEGREGANTS WILL BE FROM BLOCKS AS SINGLE GROUP

All of the people scheduled to go to the Tule Lake center under the segregation program, will be moved from the blocks as a single group, the segregation office told members of the evacuee advisory committee Wednesday. This is a change from the original plan which was to have the repa-

triate and members of their families move first, then registrants and members of their families at a later time.

The plan of movement will be on a block basis as originally announced. All of the people in a certain block will probably now go at the same time.

The instructions from the WRA provided for the movement in two groups, but officials here have had approval to change the plan. It was pointed out, that the people would prefer as much as possible to be able to travel together, and that the change would make for a more orderly transfer of the people.

Now it is possible to say that persons living in the same or adjoining blocks will probably travel together regardless of the bases on which they were designated for segregation. This (cont. on page 2)

SEGREGANTS MUST RETURN WRA PROPERTY

All government property in the hands of persons who will move to the Tule Lake center, must be turned in before they leave Poston, according to a notice given out yesterday from the Project Director's office. An inspection of baggage will be made at Tule Lake, and necessary supplies and blankets will be provided by the authorities at that center on arrival.

People who have any Government property, including blankets and other items which they have used in their homes, are required to return it prior to leaving here. Those who have tools or other supplies used in their work are required to turn these items in to the department for which they have been working. Other property or supplies should be turned in to the block manager's office.

FIRST POSTON TEACHER TO BE INDUCTED

The first Poston I High School teacher to be inducted into the United States Army was Kobe Shoji, who left Wednesday evening for Salt Lake City for induction. He was active in the student social program and taught biology and physiology last term.

APPLYING FOR REPATRIATION POSTPONED DUE TO SEGREGATION

The taking of repatriation applications has not been stopped because of the segregation program, but merely postponed because of the pressure of the work to be handled by the Welfare Division it was stated officially yesterday. Those who had sought to make appointments to discuss repatriation or to make formal application prior to August 1, when the segregation work started, will be given interviews after September 2.

WORKERS NEEDED

20 workers are needed immediately for irrigation construction work under the supervision of Mr. McDonald. The work consists of joining small canals into large ones situated west of Camp III sewage. All interested, report to the Unit III Employment Office.

The Agriculture Department is urgently need of 3 full time tractor drivers, preferably young persons. Also, 15 to 20 field crop workers to work on 160 acres in a section east of the slaughter house between Camp 1 and 2.

As soon as it is possible to announce train schedules, the dates for moving people from here will be announced

Any other persons who want to make appointments for this purpose may apply now to the Welfare Office in the Unit in which they reside. Appointments will be scheduled for interviews after September 2, according to a statement issued yesterday by Lou Butler, in charge of this work.

In Unit I, associate counsellor Alice Cheney, will have charge of the repatriation interviews; in Unit 2, assistant counsellor Esther Rhoads and in Unit 3, assistant counsellor Alice Grube.

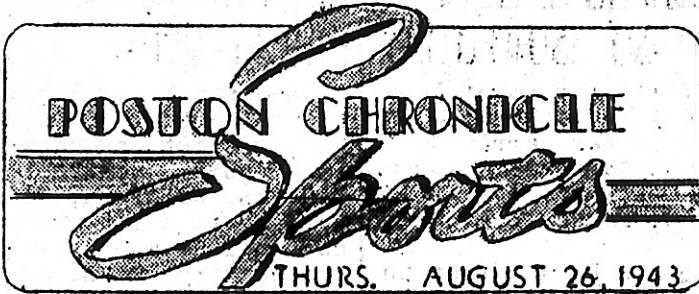

FIRST NISEI CHAPLAIN COMMISSIONED AT SHELBY

Camp Shelby, Miss---The first person of Japanese ancestry to be commissioned as chaplain in the Army of the United States has arrived to assume his duties with the Japanese American Combat Team.

He is chaplain and 1st Lt. Masao Yamada of Kealahou, Hawaii.

Chaplain Yamada received his B. A. from the University of Hawaii in 1929. He graduated from the Auburn Theological Seminary in Auburn, New York, in 1933. He has held the pastorate in Kealahou continuously since his graduation from the seminary. He spent a year in Japan studying the language but admits that he "didn't learn much".

While at the University of Hawaii, he served as the student secretary of the YMCA. During the summers he worked with boys groups in Honolulu and on the islands of Hawaii and Kawai, and, accordingly, is well acquainted with many of the Hawaiian volunteers. He also holds the distinction of being the second oldest Japanese American minister in Hawaii.

Commissioned May 29, 1943, he spent two weeks in California and an additional two weeks at Camp Ethan Allen, Vermont, on temporary duty. After completing his basic training at the Chaplains' School at Harvard University, he reported to the Combat Team this week. He will preach his first sermon this Sunday.

Chaplain Yamada's statement that "God and guns will win for the United Nations" has received national attention. He disclaims being a militant minister but declares that Christianity can do much to help the soldiers on the fighting fronts as well as to write the final peace for the victorious allies.

Speaking about conditions in Hawaii, he declared that the situation has improved tremendously because of the record volunteering of American citizens of Japanese ancestry. If persons of Japanese faces but with American backgrounds are willing to die for their country, no one can question their basic loyalty, he declared.

Chaplain Yamada held high hopes for the Combat Team and their place in history if they should be given the chance to prove their worth in battle.

Married and the father of three boys, all of whom he left behind in his native Hawaii, the chaplain has two unusual avocations. They are studying tropical fish and cultivating orchids. The former came in very handy when the Army took over the Islands after the attack on Pearl Harbor, especially in regard to his own district of Kealahou, Chaplain Yamada recalled. Short of chemists to test the purity of water, the Army medical men tried to use fish unsuccessfully until the chaplain suggested they use fish with a greater sensitivity to pure water. Their later use of gold fish in testing

Ex-Santa Fe employees may relocate in other jobs without endangering their Seniority with the Railroad, according to a letter received last week from the company by the Employment Division.

"In event any of the men are successful in obtaining other employment, the company will, upon their request, grant them a formal leave of absence with permission to engage in such other employment," E. E. McCarty, general manager of the Santa Fe Coast Lines, stated.

The letter was in answer to an inquiry by Giles L. Zimmerman, chief of the Employment Division, concerning the status of residents here who were formerly employed in Santa Fe shops and round houses, in event they relocated in other jobs.
