GRASS PLANTING - The grass planting is being carried on under the supervision of Mr. Teizo Yasuda, Mr. Kasaichi Shiomichi and Mr. Masajiro Kita. IMPORTANT - Every citizen who has not yet received his typhoid inoculation is again asked to cooperate with the Medical Staff in the Block 11 Recreational Hall and receive his inoculation immediately. To date only 150 persons out of the total population of 253 have responded. May we urge your cooperation now before the Medical Staff is required to take care of the many colonists who will arrive from now on.

BARBER SHOP - The barber shop is to be opened at Recreational Hall, Block 12 from 2 to 5 on May 16, 1942, and thereafter daily, except Sunday, from 9 to 11 in the mornings and from 1 to 5 in the afternoons. This barber shop is being operated under temporary set-up. The prices set temporarily are 20¢ for adults and 10¢ for children under 12 yrs. of age. At present there will be no hot water available so there will be no shaves or shampoos! Please bring smooth-surfaced towels when coming for haircuts.
