

# SPEEDY JOB PLACEMENT ANTICIPATED

Employment Division officials yesterday anticipated a speeding up of nisei placement in government jobs, thru' the recent regulation by the Civil Service Commission which requires an investigation of a prospective employee within 3 weeks after the appointing officer asks for it.

The presence in Post on this week of Fred F. Kelley, Civil Service investigator from Los Angeles, indicated that the commission was following this policy. Mr. Kelley stated that his investigations in the Center had priority over anything else on his docket.

Enforcement of the 3 weeks' maximum period for investigation is the first hopeful sign in the Civil Service picture since the Commission tightened up on employment of Japanese Americans in June. Since then all nisei hired in federal jobs have had to undergo a prior

## SAILING DATE FOR NEXT EXCHANGE SHIP UNKNOWN

The sailing of the Gripsholm, the chartered Swedish exchange ship, at this time has resulted in many inquiries from people who had made application for repatriation as to when they may expect to go. There is no information available as to when another sailing will be arranged, or if another will be possible.

At the present time no assurance can be given that any person who has made or may later make application for repatriation will actually go to Japan. Future consideration of each case depends on many factors, all outside the control of the WRA. Under existing regulations no one will be on the sailing list for any future exchange unless his transfer has specifically been requested by the

Japanese government through regular diplomatic channels.

It was also pointed out that to date the plans for the segregation of those persons who made application for repatriation after July first, have not been issued by Washington.

## MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS GIVEN NISEI BY CIO

The CIO War Relief News published at New York contains a special note on Nisei. The paper points out that there are a lot of loyal members of CIO unions in the relocation centers and that they

Present information indicates that the work will be seasonal, beginning Sept. 5. Additional information will be publicized as soon as it arrives.

Meanwhile, interested girls may leave their names at the unit employment offices.

Because of the numerous details involved in getting government jobs, the Employment Division asked that all Civil Service matters be cleared through Edward Nossoff, assistant chief of employment, in order to comply with the necessary procedure.

### POST-SEGREGATION PROBLEM DISCUSSED AT MEETING

By the invitation of the Executive Board, Labor Relation Board and Police Commission met last Friday afternoon with Lon Nelson's staffs to discuss the overall program and problems of post-segregation.

Extensive expansion of recreational facilities for the morale of the people who will stay here for the duration, educational program for the high school students, and problems of newspaper were discussed.

Mr. Nelson, Unit Administrator stressed that regardless of policy of the WRA, Unity and Hope are necessary to accomplish the post-segregation problems.

### 5234 JAPANESE WERE INTERNED

Government figures show that 5234 Japanese nationals were taken into custody and interned since December 7, 1941, according to a report in a Los Angeles paper.

Following individual hearings before enemy alien hearing boards, it is reported that 2079 of this figure have been ordered interned for the duration.

From incomplete figures, it was stated that at present 40 per cent of those interned were "clored" after their hearings. Some have been paroled to citizens and returned to their homes, while others have been sent to WRA centers. Approximately 1300 were "paroled" and sent to relocation centers.

### PERMIT NEEDED FOR HOT PLATES

With all electrical appliances in the Unit II Blk. Mgr's offices; those residents feeling the need of hot plates must first see Dr. D. Okonogi who will in turn submit requests with reasons to Dr. A. Pressman, Director of Health and Sanitation, who is the final authority on the issuance of such permits.

The only exceptions will be mothers with babies under the age of two, who automatically receive their hot plates.

### RELOCATION BOOKS STILL AVAILABLE

Extra copies of the booklet describing the relocation program, both in English and Japanese, are available to interested residents. The pamphlet, prepared by a message from Director Dillon S. Myer, presents the basic aims of the WRA, including a summary of leave procedures, relocation assistance, policies governing the operation of relocation centers, and other general information for evacuees.

Copies of this guide-book were distributed to the residents through the block managers about a week ago.

## PENAL CODE OF THE COMMUNITY OF POSTON

The Community Council of the Community of Poston do ordain the following Penal Code:

1. **ASSAULT** Any person who shall attempt to threaten bodily harm to another person through unlawful force or violence shall be deemed guilty of assault.
2. **ASSAULT AND BATTERY** Any person who shall willfully strike another person or otherwise inflict bodily injury, or who shall be offering violence caused another to harm himself, shall be deemed guilty of assault and battery.
3. **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT AND BATTERY** Any person who goes into the private quarters of another and is there guilty of assault and battery; any person of robust health or strength who commits an assault and battery upon one who is decrepit; any adult male who commits an assault and battery upon the person of a child or a female; any person who commits an assault and battery upon another by using an instrument or means that will inflict disgrace upon the person assaulted, as an assault or battery with a whip; any person who assaults another and inflicts serious bodily injury; any person who assaults another with a premeditated design, and with means calculated to inflict great bodily injury, shall be deemed guilty of aggravated assault and battery.
4. **RIOT** Any two or more persons acting together without authority of law who use any force of violence, who disturb the public peace, or who threaten to use such force or violence or to disturb the public peace, if their conduct be accompanied by immediate power of execution, shall be deemed guilty of riot.
5. **UNLAWFUL ASSEMBLY** Any two or more persons who assemble together to do an unlawful act, and separate without doing or advancing toward it, or who assemble together and do a lawful act in a violent, boisterous, or tumultuous manner, shall be deemed guilty of unlawful assembly.
6. **GAMBLING** Any persons who shall engage in any game whatsoever played with cards, dice, or other device for money, checks, credits, or any other thing of value, shall be deemed guilty of gambling.
7. **GAMBLING HOUSE** Any person who shall permit any building or structure of which he is in possession to be used for the purpose of conducting any game whatsoever played with cards, dice, or other device for money, checks, credits, or other thing of value shall be deemed guilty of operating a gambling house.
8. **OPERATING A CONFIDENCE GAME** Any person who with intent to cheat and defraud, shall obtain or attempt to obtain from any other person any money, property, or valuable thing whatever, fraudulent representation or statement or pretense, or by any other means, instrument, or device, or by means or by use of any false or bogus check, or by any other printed, written or engraved instrument, or spurious coin or metal shall be deemed guilty of operating a confidence game.
