**A. T. T. ENDORSES
RELOCATION**

The American Federation of Teachers endorsed the relocation program in a resolution adopted last month in Chicago, Illinois. The resolution pointed out that the continued holding of American citizens of Japanese descent and loyal Japanese in relocation centers was not only "destruction to the morale and faith in the ideals for which America stands," but also is a practice of segregation and discrimination based on race, which is contrary to the principles of the Declaration of Independence and of the Constitution."

And in view of the fact that evacuees were capable of making a cultural and material contribution to American civilization, the convention recommended a speedy release from the relocation centers of "all loyal American citizens of Japanese descent and all Japanese whose loyalty to the United States and its democratic institutions is unquestioned.

POSTON I SCHOOLS TO OPEN SEPTEMBER 27

**RETURN TO HAWAII
NOW POSSIBLE**

First instance of a resident of Poston being granted permission to return to Hawaii was announced by the Leave Office.

Miss Misue Ogata, 12-9-A, has been granted priority on passage by the Office of the Military Governor, Hawaii, and she is authorized to return as soon as shipping facilities are available.

The Leave Office stated that other residents desiring to return to Hawaii may apply for permission to cross by contacting the Commanding General of the Hawaiian Area. Applicants to be eligible, must be bona fide residents of the Islands, it was pointed out.

**MOSQUITO MENACE
RE-OCCURS IN UNIT I.**

Poston I is again faced with conditions which may prove to be as tormenting as it was in the months of June and July, after a few weeks of respite from the bites and curses of mosquitoes, according to the Sanitation Dept.

A survey conducted on the ponds within Unit I has proven that residents are becoming more and more lax in the cleaning and upkeep of their ponds. Consequently, mosquitoes (cont on page 2)

The Poston I elementary and high schools will open on the 27th of September after repeated postponements due to the school buildings. According to Dr. A. L. Harris, no more postponements anticipated.

Several trained local teachers are needed in the high school to teach such vocational courses as auto mechanics, mechanical drafting, woodshop, agriculture and general shop. Unless teachers are available, those courses have to be closed to the students, Dr. Harris stated.

It is hoped that this action will be unnecessary because along with the program of night school classes vocational training will lead to job opportunities for relocators.

**ARTHUR MAIN NEW
HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL**

Arthur M. Main arrived in Poston last Friday, to take over the position of principal of the Poston I High School.

Mr. Main is formerly of La Jolla, California, and attended the College of the Pacific, The University of California, and received his MA degree at Stanford University.

TULE LAKE TRAINS TO LEAVE 3 P.M.

In accordance to the present plans, three trains for the segregants to Tule Lake, will leave Parker at 3 o'clock in the afternoon on October 4, 5, and 7.

The movement of those segregants will probably start before noon, because it will be necessary to do so in order to have sufficient motor transport. Arrangements for hauling the greater part of the checkable baggage will be made the day before.

CERTIFICATION OF POSTON SCHOOLS BY STATE NOT NECESSARY

Poston Schools do not have to be accredited by the state of Arizona for their students to be accepted by the schools in other states. Under the present arrangement, according to Dr. A. L. Harris, Poston schools are directed by the Indian Service which is a federal agency whose credits are recognized in all parts of the U.S.

After the first rush of work of the beginning of school is over, Dr. Harris plans to contact the necessary officials preparatory to securing the accreditation of the Poston Schools by the State of Arizona.

CLEVELAND HOSTEL PLACES 31 POSTONIANS

In the first fifteen weeks of operation, the Cleveland Hostel has facilitated the relocation of 115 Japanese-Americans and Japanese, 31 of whom were formerly from Poston. Approximately one out of every four people in Cleveland, therefore, have passed through the Hostel, according to the Hostel.

The Hostel method of relocation has proved eminently satisfactorily with every person who has been at the Hostel finding jobs and adequate housing. So far, no one has been returned to camp from the Hostel.

"It has been our experience that most nisei find jobs within a week after their arrival. Housing is provided shortly thereafter, making the average person's stay at the Hostel about two weeks," stated Max X. Franzen, Hostel Director.

Hostel accommodations are arranged on an invitation basis. The Cleveland Hostel Representative at Poston is Rev. Jitsuo Morikawa, 35-2-A. Persons interested in being invited to the Hostel should contact Rev. Morikawa.

**CANDY FIRM
SEEKS PACKERS**

The Outside Employment Department today announced an opportunity for 10 to 20 girls interested in packing chocolate candies in the Shotwell Manufacturing Company in Chicago, Illinois.

The work consists of putting chocolate pieces into individual cups and arranging them in one pound boxes. It was reported that working conditions are very sanitary, and that the plant is air-conditioned.

The company guarantees a minimum of 50¢ an hour or a piece work rate of .0175 per box. On a piece work basis, it is possible for an individual to make from \$5 to \$6.50 a day. Some of the more experienced girls are making as high as \$7 to \$8 a day.
