October 11 has been set as the date for the election of the Local Councils in all three units, and the names of nominees must be in the City Clerk's office not later than 10 and not earlier than 15 days before the election date, Ted Haas, Project Attorney, announced last week.

The manner of nomination will be decided by the individual blocks, and additional nominations of qualified persons may be made by a petition signed by not less than 10 eligible voters from a block.

Eligible voters are those persons who are 18 years or older and have been bona fide residents of Poston for at least four months. Pools will open on Oct. 11 from 2 to 8 p.m.

Induction into office will be held five days after the election.

Full information about nominations and voting will be found posted on every block bulletin board.
