PROCEDURE FOR STUDENT EMPLOYMENT ANNOUNCED

In a memorandum from Francis E. Cushman, Principal of Postom III Schools, to the employment office the follow ing regulations were issued in regards to student employment:

1. No student will be permitted to work more than 20 hours per week nor more than 6 days in any one week.

2. The maximum amount of combined school and work hours in any one day must not exceed 8.
3. To obtain a work permit a student must bring an offer of employment stating the hours during which he will be employed.

No notice of assignment should be given to any student until he presents a work per mit. The only signature which will be recognized on the work permit is that of the principal of Miss H.G. Lavarnway. Counselor.
