

JAPANESE STILL RETAIN RIGHTS

Paul Scharrenberg, state Director of Industrial Relations of California, in a report to Governor Earl Warren revealed that former Japanese residents of the State who are now in centers, still retain their rights under California state laws pertaining to social benefits, including workmen's compensation benefits.

Scharrenberg disclosed that a Japanese enemy alien now in a Colorado Center recently received \$800 as a result of a fractured leg which he suffered while working in California.

DATA COMPILED ON EVACUEES

The problems and program for the relocation of Japanese Americans are described in a new loan packet to be distributed by the U.S. Office of Education, according to information received recently from the Washington Office.

This group of pamphlets and other reading matter on various phases of relocation has been compiled from material supplied by WRA, and will be distributed by the Information Exchange of the Office of Education to libraries, teachers, welfare agencies, and civic organizations.

More than 30 items have been assembled in the series, including general information on evacuation and relocation and special articles on summer school programs, student relocation, library services, and adult education. It is expected that the series will be a valuable source of information for educators and others interested in the WRA program.

Superintendents of Education at center schools may borrow this packet by writing the Information Exchange, U. S. Office of Education, Washington, D.C. Specific request should be made for Packet VI-G-I, Japanese American Relocation.

LET'S HAVE AN USO

Every day now, everywhere you look you see a boy in kahki walking around camp. He is probably one of the 553 servicemen that the big service flag in the ad building honors.

Usually the soldier does not seem to be having any special kind of fun. His walking seems aimless. This visit may be his last furlough before going overseas, and he should be very busy making the memories that will keep him happy while he is apart from the family and old friends.

But will he, when he goes back to camp, complain about Poston, "God, what a dead dump that was!"?

Yoshio Ekimoto, assistant block manager's supervisor, feels that what Poston and the visiting servicemen need is a place where they can go, a place where they can feel at ease, a place where they can have some fun.

He points out the example that a couple of other centers, Heart Mountain and Jerome, have set. They have established USO's that seem to have been very successful in making the soldiers feel that it was worth saving money for the trip back.

FALL CROP FIGURES TOLD

J. Fukuhara, supervisor of Unit II Truck Farm, disclosed that 54,600 lbs. of casaba and 24,914 lbs. of honey-dew were harvested at the 80 acre farm this year. The crop yield were lower than expected because of mildew.

He also revealed the following acreage of various vegetables planted at the 40 acre lot, section 15, north of Unit II.

Five acres of carrots, five acres of broccoli, five acres cabbage, 15 acres of mungo beans for moyashi, and ten acres of soy beans were trampled and damaged by the horses.

Other acreage within the Unit includes:

Eight acres of lettuce, four and one-half acres of carrots, five acres spinach, and five acres of daikon.

Joseph S. Ogawa, manager of the Poultry Dept. disclosed that 5,487 dozens of locally produced eggs have been distributed to the Unit Mess Halls.

UNIT II P.T.A. CABINET ELECTED

Under the chairmanship of Kazuo Ikeda, vice-principal, thirty PTA members composed of representatives from each block of Unit II, held an election last Friday at 410 Less Hall.

INDEFINITE LEAVES SURPASS SEASONS

Poston III boasts 375 seasonal workers who have done their share in the war effort by answering the manpower shortage call in vegetable and sugar-beet fields from January 2 to November 11. Of the total seasonal workers 58 left for Preston, Idaho; 28 for Newell, Calif.; 25 for Palisades, Colo.; 24 for Lewiston, Utah; 18 for Salina, Utah; 11 for Logandale, Nevada; and others to all parts of the United States. Many have completed their contracts and are returning this month.

Surpassing the seasonal leave is the indefinite with 572 people already having left Unit III. Chicago seems to be the choicest city with 115 evacuees relocated in that area. Cleveland and Heights, Ohio comes in second with 52, followed by Denver with 40.

WALL PAPER DISTRIBUTED

The long awaited rolls of pink and grey wall paper were distributed to each block manager's office in Unit III last Wednesday. Each block manager will be responsible for its distribution and tacking.

SOCIOLOGICAL RESEARCH OFFICE DISBANDED

EVACUEES TAKE OVER AS UNIT ADMINISTRATORS

FORMER ADMINISTRATORS SHIFTED

On Monday, November 22, Seichi Nomura will take office as Unit I administrator while Kenji Uyeno and Gerald Wumino will become unit administrators in II and III, respectively.

Their duties and responsibilities will be those which have been heretofore discharged by the three Caucasian administrators, Len Nelson, James Crawford and Morris Burge.

In another major administrative change, Len Nelson, former Unit I administrator, has been appointed chief officer of the new employment section, while Ralph Drennen, assistant placement officer, has been made his assistant. The new section will manage both appointed and evacuee personnel on the entire project.

James Crawford, former Unit II administrator, has been made chief officer of the separately-created Relocation division, and Ed Nossoff, former assistant employment chief, has been selected as his assistant.

For the time being, Giles Zimmerman, employment chief, will continue in the relocation office, while Morris Burge, former Unit III administrator, will work with the new unit administrator for a few weeks.

These men have been chosen for their positions because they have won the right to responsibility by their past performance in project duties. W. Ward Head, project director, said in making the announcement.

NISEI DEFENDED BY GREW

NEW YORK CITY (Via Wire) --- Loyal American citizens of Japanese ancestry were strongly defended by Joseph G. Grew, former Ambassador to Japan and Special Assistant to the Secretary of State, in a speech in New York City last Thursday night, at the annual dinner of the Holland Society after receiving the Society's Gold Medal for distinguished achievement. This medal is awarded annually to a non-member of the society.

In his speech, Mr. Grew said that loyal American citizens of Japanese descent should not be made the victims of war-time prejudice.

"I have too great a belief in the sanctity of American citizenship to want to see those Americans of Japanese descent penalized and alienated through blind prejudice," Mr. Grew said. "I want to see them given a square deal. I want to see them treated as we rightly treat all other American citizens regardless of their racial origin---with respect and support, unless or until they have proved themselves unworthy of respect and support".

That fundamental principle, Mr. Grew said, "should apply all along the line---to every citizen of the United States of America."

Mr. Grew said that the nation must take every proper step to protect the country from hostile acts, espionage or sabotage, but the competent official authorities were attending to that constantly and effectively.

"I do know that like the Americans of German descent," he said, "the overwhelming majority of Americans of Japanese origin wish to be and are wholly loyal to the United States, and not only that, but they wish to prove that loyalty in service of their native land."

Mr. Grew quoted press reports from the 5th Army in Italy saying that the first unit of American-born Japanese troops went into combat "smiling with satisfaction as if they were going to a baseball game, their motto is 'Remember Pearl Harbor'".
