

TRAVEL FROZEN FOR CIVILIAN

All civilian travel is being frozen from Dec. 12, 1943 to Jan. 12, 1944, according to Santa Fe railroad officials who visited Poston last week. The army is scheduled to use every available car for the transportation of soldiers during the holiday season and project departures will be curtailed except as follows:

(1) Special car, Nov. 20, east via Santa Fe railroad to Kansas City and Chicago.

(2) Departure to Barstow, Dec. 2, north via Santa Fe and Union Pacific railroads to Salt Lake.

(3) Special car, Dec. 10, east, same as (1).

(4) Special car, Jan. 4, east, same as (1) and (3).

Morning departures will be held to a minimum of 4 daily, and emergency departures will be considered and sent out at the discretion of W. Allen Cushman, Leave Officer head, but there is no guarantee that departures will be able to get out of Wickenburg. (cont. on page 2)

FOUR IMPROVEMENT IN SCHOOL RECOMMENDED BY SCHOOL OFFICIALS

Representatives of the North American Association of Secondary Schools and the Arizona State Department of Education, Dr. O. K. Garretson and Rollah Aston, visitors of Poston the past week, forwarded to Dr. A. L. Harris, Director of Education, a report of recommendations for

changes which should be made in the high schools, within a certain period, before the reports are submitted to the state committee.

The four most important conditions to be met are: 1. the provision of more scientific equipment in the laboratories, particularly in physics, 2. the completion of the secondary school buildings in Unit I also the immediate provision of shower facilities for Physical Education classes. 242,224 POUNDS OF VEGETABLES GROWN BY AG.

A total of \$8266.68 worth of fresh produce were grown and delivered to the Subsistence Dept. by the Unit I Ag. Dept. during the period of Sept. 27 to Nov. 12, the department reported.

Vegetables harvested and delivered included: shiro-uri, 75,365 lbs.; nappa, 52,765 lbs.; eggplant, 46,075 lbs.; daikon, 57,531 lbs.; Armenian cukes, 7,450 lbs.; and Sasage beans, 3,038 lbs. The total amount produced is reported to be 242,224 lbs.

In addition to the above items, 300,000 pounds or more vegetables such as sweet potatoes, broccoli, daikon, nappa, spinach, and peanuts are to be harvested before the end of the year.

Furthermore, to assure fresh vegetable supplies for the coming spring, seeding has been started.

as very adequate for the needs, on the other hand, stated that the school plants in Units II and III will be quite satisfactory as soon as cabinets, sinks and other special equipment are installed. 3. the necessity to recruit fully qualified teachers up to the limit of the budget provisions was pointed out, however, in a few cases, exception will be made where the work of a teacher is rated very good, although, he does not fully meet the state preparation requirements. Transcripts of a number of teachers have not been secured from the colleges so it is impossible to determine exactly the changes which may be made and 44. the development of school programs in agriculture, general shop work, and integrated home making courses.

The visitors felt that Poston have made a beginning in development in the work in these fields, but pointed out that certain needs for additional equipment for less specialization in the home making course.

Immediate action is also being planned in all three secondary schools to meet the requirements for state accreditation.
