EXPATRIATES AND REPATRIATES MAY APPLY FOR WITHDRAWAL

Although it is not yet known, whether future exchanges of repatriates and expatriates will be made with Japan after the completion of the Gripsholm exchange at Mormugao, negotiations on names for future exchanges are continuing in diplomatic channels.

Therefore, it is important that exchange list records be correct, and evacuees who wish to (1) withdraw their application for exchange or (2) expatriate or repatriate and have not yet applied for exchange, are asked to contact the Unit Welfare Family offices.

PAROLED DOGS MAY ARRIVE

Due to the shortage of doctors in this center, Moris Burge, Y. Kawasaki, of the council and Ayaka Takahashi of the Red Cross returned to Poston last Monday, after making negotiations with the five interned doctors at the Santa Fe Detention Station, to come to Poston after they have been granted their parole.

The names of the doctors that are tentatively scheduled to arrive in the near future are: Drs. Benjamin M. Tanaka, Gensaku Akimoto, T.H. Furukochi, Yochi Ueyehara and Jiro Yoshizawa.

When application for expatriation or repatriation are made, the names are sent to Japan where they are reviewed by the Japanese government. Names accepted for the next exchange are reported back to the United States, and it will be difficult to withdraw the application once Japan has indicated acceptance of it.

Those who signed their withdrawals of requests for repatriation or expatriation, since July 1, 1943, will be given leave clearance hearings here if they are still in Poston.

The Gripsholm is now on its return trip from Mormugao. Those who left United States on the Gripsholm have arrived in Japan.

EVAQUEE TRAVEL DISCOURAGED

In a direct wire received by the Departure Station from Dillon S. Myer, WRA director and also from the Santa Fe Railways, it stressed that evacuee transportation be curtailed thru, Dec. 12 to Jan. 12 exclusively, unless the necessity of travel is essential.

The wire stated that soldiers on furlough will be given priority over civilians travel during the holiday season.

It was noted that up to date, the Denver-Wickenburg busline is 50 percent evacuee passengers. The Departure Station discourages evacuee travel due to a number of soldiers on leave from the South

Voice of an Issei

OUR MEDICAL STAFF

The most worthy of all scientific achievements of modern days, in my opinion, is one in relation to the medicine and surgery. The medical science appears to be the real pivot around which the wholesome society of men could be established. Indeed, the good health is the first and last consideration in all human affairs. Both in time of peace and war, a man's health is of the first importance and in a way, that the survival of the fittest means the survival of healthiest. The progress of medical science means the preservation of healthy race of men and our posterity will remember the names of Pasteur and Kitazato as benefactors of mankind, if they could remember anything at all.

And whenever I come across an announcement in our Chronicle of a doctor going away, it always gives me a headache. A doctor going away from our center is surely going to find a good paying job or practice somewhere and possibly, some happiness along with it, no doubt. But to think of many, many ailing patients who are being left behind him would, without any doubt, feel keenly the loss of their favorite doctor to whom they used to cling like the infants to their fond mothers' knees. The fondness and dependence with which they had looked up to their doctor is at an end. Forlorn and dejected, the patients suffer more acutely, with consequential tardiness in recovery. And yet, we can not stop any doctor going away from our relocation center. What could we do about it?

Only recently, two doctors left here and two came in to make up the loss. Another one has gone out a few days ago and there is no one to take up what he had left off at the General Hospital.

The world outside might again look very much brighter than within to the remaining medical staff. The resettlement programme includes every body--no medical scientists barred and they may go out any time and then we may lose all of them and such is our sad case. And some day, the Poston General Hospital stands there in the burning sands--chuck full of sick people in it, with no doctors and a thousand of buzzards wheeling over the roof top! Isn't it rather too preposterous to think of such a thing?

A Government pamphlet shown me some eighteen months ago has clearly stated that there will be physicians, nurses and a hospital in each center for evacuees and there was nothing ambiguous in the statement of the W.R.A., in its original intention of making these facilities real and naturally, the expenses incurred thereby in carrying out its project must have been duly considered.

Therefore, the Voice here wants to propose to the W.R.A., to keep all our physicians and trained nurses under the Government regulation payroll as an inducement to keep them in and by so doing, the Government can insure our good health and uphold our moral strength. K.T.
