THREE NABBED WITH SAKE

Robert Mukogawa, 26, Masao Takanashi, 22, Sakae Koichi, 17, were taken to Phoenix Tuesday morning to appear before the United States Commissioner for investigation on charges growing out of possession of liquor.

Takanashi and Koichi were caught late Saturday night near the boundary of the project with 30 cases of sake wine in their possession. Mukogawa, to whom the sake was to be delivered, was picked up by project authorities Sunday. The liquor was brought to the project by a Caucasian, said to be from Phoenix, who is as yet unapprehended.

Mukogawa was lodged in the Indian Service Jail in Parker pending transfer to Federal authorities while the two younger men remained in the custody of project authorities.

KARIYA NEW UNIT I POLICE CHIEF

Masashi Kariya, 34, and a former captain on the Poston I Police Force, has been chosen to succeed Yoshinobu Ota as chief of police. Chief Ota left recently for outside employment in Denver.

The new gendarme head is from Orange County and has been on the

force since its establishment. Under him will be three captains: Sam Mihara, Henry Ono and Yukinobu Tao. Chief Kariya himself will captain one of the squads because of the shortage of men.

Strict enforcement of laws has been announced as the continued policy, and no leniency will be shown to traffic violators or other transgressors of the law. A ten-day sentence in Parker Indian Jail for a person charged with assault and battery has been reported.

One of the latest activities of the department has been the posting of four police guards in the school zone.

TOKIO STOPS REPATRIATION

WASHINGTON—It was learned authoritatively that Japan has notified the U.S. Government that it will not permit the repatriation of anymore American nationals from the Far East until the Spanish Authorities make a complete and thorough investigation of the relocation and detention camps in this country.

The Japanese government's action is regarded as a direct outcome of the recent disturbance at Tule Lake where the troops took over the camp.

TULE PRODUCE ARRIVES HERE

The Colorado River War Relocation Center has received six carloads of vegetables from the Tule Lake farms, including potatoes, cabbage, turnip, cauliflower, and carrots, according to figures compiled by the Tule Lake farm office, and released by the local Relocation Division through Joe Owashi, Unit III employment manager.

These vegetables are part of the crops harvested from Nov. 1 to Nov. 26 by the 234 volunteer workers from the relocation centers who took over when the segregation center residents refused to complete the work.

Of the 52 carloads of produce that were sent to the relocation projects, Gila received 14; Granada, 1 of cabbage; Mimidoka, 10; Manzanar, 4; Heart Mountain, 3; Jerome, 3, and Topaz, 11. Nine carloads of potatoes were sold to the Pacific Fruit and Produce Company.

To Tule Lake Center went 1,881 sacks and crates of cabbage; 804 sacks and crates of carrots; 786 sacks of potatoes and smaller amounts of cauliflower, beets, daikon, radish, broccoli, onion, parsnip, spinach and turnip.

In addition, there are 786 crates of cabbage and 225 sacks of carrots in storage at Tule Lake, as well as 7,403½ sacks of barley in the granary. At Taylor Warehouse No. 3, there are 60,758 bushels of potatoes, 443 crates of cabbage, 880 crates of carrots and 1,273 crates of beets in storage.

The 64 men from Poston who went to the Tule Lake farms expressed satisfaction at having assisted in this immense harvest, Edward Nossoff, assistant relocation officer, said

FIRE DESTROYS GRANARY
IN GILA CENTER

Farm property valued at approximately \$1700 went up into flames Dec. 1, the worst fire to date in Gila, when the granary was destroyed by fire of an unknown origin, reports the Gila News Courier.

One to two tons each of tankage, bonemeal, cottonseed meal, barley, ground alfalfa meal and corn were lost in the fire.

The 20' by 100' granary structure roughly estimated at \$1200 was burnt completely to the foundation.

BIDDLE GIVES
CREDIT TO JAPAN

WASHINGTON--American prisoners of war in Japan were given better treatment than required by international law, declared Attorney General Biddle before a congressional committee recently.

Appearing as a witness before the Dies subcommittee investigating the Tule Lake riot, Mr. Biddle asserted Japan has gone far beyond requirements of the Geneva pact.

He stated that Japan is watching the treatment of the Tule internees with interests. If the Tule Center is kept under Army guard, conditions in Japan for American prisoners may become worse, stated Biddle.

He explained that under the Constitution American Citizens "can not be taken from their homes" yet 75 per cent of the interned Japanese are American Citizens.
