Many children in Poston are now suffering from the colds that have been prevalent during the past two weeks.

Teachers have been instructed that children who come to school with head colds, running

noses or coughs be sent home.

When the children come home they should be put to bed, kept evenly warm, given plenty of water and liquids to drink. Usually a child who is given this cure recovers promptly and cun return to school in a few days.

If a child has been absent three days or longer, he should come to Ward 7 at 8:30 a.m. to be inspected before returning to school.

If the child is found to be all right,

If a child is feverish or has a sore throat, he should be brought by the clinic for examination by a doctor.
