DUNCAN MILLS SUCCEEDS HEAD AS LOCAL PROJECT DIRECTOR

FORMER DIRECTOR GOES TO D.C. AS HEAD OF INDIAN SERVICE

Coming to introduce Duncan Mills who has been appointed acting director of the Poston project. Dillon S. Myer, national director of the War Relocation Authority is a visitor here today. Mr. Myer who is en route from San Francisco where he attended a conference of WRA officials will leave this evening to

catch a plane for Washington.

Mr. Mills will succeed W. Wade Head, who has been project director ever since the center was established. He comes from the Washington office of WRA and has visited Poston several times remaining here for several weeks several months ago.

Mr. Head, who left his work as superintendent of the Papago Indian Reservation to take over the project will return there as General Superintendent with jurisdiction over the reservations at Sells Gila Bend and San Xavier. During the difficult days following evacuation and the months since Mr. Head has won the respect and admiration of the residents of the center who regret very much to lose him. He was hampered well in the resumption of his former work.

Mr. Myer addressed evacuation leaders at a meeting in the high school auditorium at 1 o'clock this afternoon. Unit administrators members of all three councils, block members and other community leaders attended. He will speak again at 2:30 at a meeting of appointment personnel in the auditorium. At 5 o'clock he will be guest of honor at a dinner given by the Community Council in the Block 33 mess hall. Immediately following he will leave the project on his return journey to Washington.

I am proud of the schools, the fields under cultivation, the progress you have made in many ways in the past 20 months. The associations during that time will always be among my most valued memories.

The knowledge that Duncan Mills, my friend of long standing, is taking my place as your director gives me a great deal of pleasure for I know that you will receive every consideration at his hands. I bespeak for him the same whole hearted cooperation that you have given me.
