## JACL LEADER SPEAKS AT MESS 32

Joe Masuoka, head of the Denver JACL office and columnist for the Pacific Citizen, and Min Yasui, former Portland lawyer who figured in the curfew "test case," were speakers at a special meeting held last Sunday evening at Mess 32.

Introduced by Chairman Tom Masuda, Masuoka told of the extensive public relations work that the national JACL is doing to combat prejudice and dis-

crimination, and said that the absence of physical violence toward relocated evicuees was an encouraging sign. The few "incidents" which have been widely publicized were grossly exaggerated, and the relocation center papers, especially, have given on their unnatural emphasis, he said. He urged all who were able to relocate.

Yasui, who is now a resident of Minidoka, touched on the "test case" in his talk. One of the lessons he has learned from it, he said, was that no one individual, no matter how important, was able to accomplish very much alone, and that Japanese-Americans, individually and co-operatively, must do their share of "public relations" work.

Another speaker at the meeting was Cpl. George Inagaki from Camp Savage, (Min.) Masuoka and Yasui, who were accompanied here by two Arizonans, Tetsuo Ikeda (of the recent Arizona "anti-Jap" case) and Shiro Wakido, returned to Phoenix Sunday night.

## MESSAGE TO THE RESIDENTS

From Acting Project Director

I am sorry that the occasion for my coming to Poston should be Mr. Head's departure. I know that Poston will miss him deeply. I know that during his many months here the residents of Poston have come to regard him with affection and respect, as I do myself, and as everyone in this does.

Under Mr. Head's leadership the people of Poston have made a record of which they may well be proud. It is a record of a great deal of constructive work performed in the building of schools, the preparation of land and the growing of food, and in the countless other daily tasks of the center. It is a record of successful relocation by many former residents who have found their place in American life. It is a record of many now in the military service. And it is a record generally of successful adjustment to difficult conditions. This adjustment is evidenced by the existing and relationship between the evicuee population of Poston and the administrative staff. It shows up also in the advances made by the evicuees in local self-government and in the assumption of responsibility for the management of internal affairs. I shall count on them to continue to shoulder these responsibilities.

I shall also, of course, lean heavily on the fine administrative staff at Poston, appointed and evicuee, who should share in the credit for the achievements of the community. I feel fortunate in having such a fine group to carry the heavy load of administrative work.

I am happy to be here with you. I will do everything that I can to merit your confidence. I ask for your support and goodwill, and I promise you mine.
